HOUSING DIRECTORATE

Tackling homelessness is a key priority for Galway County Council. The preventative measures now include:

Homeless HAP Place Finder Service: Since the commencement of the Homeless Place Finder Service in November 2018, **156** households have been accommodated in total; 72 are singles and the remaining are households with children.

Tenancy Sustainment Officer, Homeless Support Worker (Homeless Team): Section 10 Homeless funding supported the employment of two staff. They are the first points of contact for Homeless clients. Social Work will provide a case management function to clients who have been assessed and are in receipt of approved Emergency Accommodation.

Housing First: We are working in partnership with the agencies in rolling out and implementing Housing First. This model offers an opportunity to meet the complex needs of clients.

Roundstone development is nearing completion:

Comprising of 4 no. single-storey 2 bed dwellings, 8no. two-storey 2 bed dwellings, 2 no. twostorey 3 bed dwellings, car parking, associated wastewater treatment plant, provision of greenspace, connection to existing services and all ancillary site development.



INFRASTRUCTURE & OPERATIONS DIRECTORATE

Climate Adaptation and Resilience Works 2021

An allocation of €15m is being made available to local authorities funded under the department's regional and local road maintenance and renewal grant programme for climate adaptation and resilience schemes. The Department is now inviting local authorities to submit applications for consideration for funding. It has been indicated that any allocation approved must be for works which can be completed and claimed by the end of November 2021. The closing date for receipt of applications is 31st March 2021.

Clifden Flood Relief Scheme

On 1st march the council issued an invitation to tender for Consultants to undertake the engineering and environmental elements of the Clifden Flood Relief Scheme. The objective of the scheme is to identify and design a solution that alleviates the risk of flooding, obtain the necessary planning and environmental consents, procure, manage and oversee the construction of the scheme. The closing date for receipt of tenders is 12th April and it is expected the successful consultant will be appointed in May or June 2021.

RURAL FUNDING SCHEMES - CLÁR 2021

Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys TD launched a €5.5 million CLÁR 2021 programme with a 10% increase on 2020 funding. This includes a new Innovation Measure to support communities to develop and test new project ideas.

- CLÁR is targeted funding for small infrastructural projects in rural areas experiencing depopulation - projects must be located in a Clár area and proposals based on locally identified priorities;
 - Measure 1 Safety Measures at Schools or Community Facilities
 - Measure 2 Outdoor Community Recreation Facilities
 - Measure 3A Community Gardens, Allotments & Sensory Gardens
- ✓ Any facilities funded must be publicly accessible without appointment, with clear arrangements in place to insure and manage the facility
- ✓ Applications to for Measures 1, 2 and 3A are to be submitted to Galway County Council by email April 15th <u>clar@galwaycoco.ie</u>
- Local Authority may submit up to 10 applications between Measure 1 & 2, and max of 3 under Measure 3A by May 7th 2021.
- ✓ €5,000 to €50,000 subject to maximum 90% of total costs
 - You will also note, the Measure 3(b) Scheme Outline Mobility and Cancer Care Transport, <u>which seeks applications directly to the Department</u> to assist groups providing mobility and cancer care transport services to people living in CLÁR areas.

CLÁR Innovation Measures – New Measure

(EOI's by closing date Friday 21st May 2021 to the Department of Rural and Community Development)

- Innovative or pilot projects which address specific challenges of Clár areas such as rural isolation, village decline, service accessibility, population change, social disadvantage and marginalisation;
- Applications are submitted directly to the Department not Galway County Council and must demonstrate cross-community and cross-organisational ways of working to deliver outcomes, consider new or innovative ways to deliver services, and/or implement approaches or ideas which can be replicated elsewhere;

- €5,000 €50,000 with varying match funding levels, e.g. up to 95% for community groups approvals may be announced in tranches throughout the year;
- Eligible Applicants: LA's, LDC's, Community Groups, Representative bodies for businesses and other Organisations located in Clár areas (must be formally established, i.e. CLG).
- Response to queries: pilot project can be across a number of DED's once they are all in Clár and expenditure can be allowed on capital as well as current expenditure
