

CSO Release Parental Involvement in Children's Education Survey

A module on parents' involvement in their children's education was included in the Quarterly National Household Survey (QNHS) in the second quarter of 2012. Some of the main findings:

- 69% of primary school children and 13% of secondary school children are helped daily by their parents with homework.
- 4% of primary school and 28% of secondary school children never receive help with their homework.
- Overall 59% of school children's parents feel very confident about helping their children with homework.
- This rises to 72% where the mother has a 3rd level degree and 75% where the father has a 3rd level degree
- 61% of parents whose first language was English or Irish felt very confident about assisting with their children's homework. In contrast just 47% of parents whose first language was not English or Irish felt very confident about assisting.



County Galway Live Register Figures

Population

• The West is predicted to have the smallest growth in population between 2011 and 2031 with only an increase of 15,000 people and an annual increase of 0.2%.

Age

- Average life expectancy for males is projected to increase from 78.3 years in 2011 to 83.0 years in 2031.
- Average life expectancy for females is projected to increase from 82.9 years in 2011 to 86.6 years in 2031.
- The number of people over the age of 65 in the West will increase from 57,000 in 2011 to 100,000 in 2031.

- The older age dependency ratio in the West will increase from 19.6% in 2011 to 35.1% in 2031.
- The West will have the highest age dependency ratio of the 8 regional areas.
- The younger age dependency ratio will decrease from 31.7% in 2011 to 24.6% in 2031.
- The total age dependency ratio will increase from 51.3% in 2011 to 59.8% in 2031.

Migration

- The West will have the highest external migration with 100,000 people expected to leave.
- It is also expected that 60,000 less people will migrate to the West.





Figure 6 Projected population under M2F2 Traditional

CSO Information and Communication Technology (ICT) Household Survey 2013



- 84% of households in 2013 have access to a computer at home.
- 82% of households have access to the internet at home.
- 78% of individuals used the internet in the last 3 months.
- 61% of individuals used the internet every day in the last three months.
- The most popular activities of individuals who accessed the internet in the last three months were email (67%), finding information about goods or services (61%), social networking (48%) and using services related to travel or travel related accommodation (45%).
- Other travel arrangements (28%), holiday accommodation (26%) and tickets for events (26%) were the most popular types of internet purchases in the 12 months prior to Q1 2013.

Domestic Travel

- Irish residents took almost 2.6 million domestic trips in the 3rd quarter of 2013, an increase of 5.0% compared to the same period in 2012.
- Each trip lasted 3.8 nights on average.
- Over half of all domestic trips (60.3%) were classified as holidays, while a quarter (25.2%) were to visit friends or relatives.
- Nearly 40% of trips used hotel accommodation while 26% stayed with family and friends.
- Total expenditure on domestic trips in Quarter 3 2013 amounted to €571.1 million.



Outbound Travel

- More than 2.1 million Irish people travelled outside the state in the 3rd quarter 2013 spending €1,944.1 million.
- The average length of stay was 9.9 nights. The UK remains the most popular destination, followed by Spain and France.
- Holidays accounted for almost two thirds (63.7%), while almost a quarter (23.2%) were to visit friends or relatives.
- Self-catering/rented accommodation was the most popular accommodation, followed by hotel and then staying with family and friends accounted for 4.7 million nights.
