## Douglas Hyde Literary Award For Irish Journalist

THE trustees of Ciste an Chraoibhin Aoibhinn (Douglas Hyde Literary Fund) have decided to make the award for the year 1938 to Tomas Bairead for his work, "An Geall a Briseadh," issued by the Publications Branch of the Department of Education.

Tomas Bairead was born in Moyeullen in Iar-Connacht, the birthplace of another well-known writer, Ruaidhri O Flaithbeartaigh, author of "Iar-Chonnacht" and other works.

He is a Journalist attached to the reporting staff of Independent Newspapers.

"An Geall a Briseadh" is a collection of short stories and sketches dealing mainly with scenes and events familiar to the writer in his native countryside. These are related in Irish of the purest quality as spoken in Connemara.

## PREVIOUS DISTINCTION

It is interesting to note that a previous work of a somewhat similar nature by the same writer entitled "Cumhacht na Cinneamhna" was granted the O'Growney Award by the Irish Academy of Letters in 1937.
