From The Poor Law Com<sup>rs</sup> N<sup>o</sup> 13447 1843 dated 21<sup>st</sup> July 1843. forwarding a series of questions for answers to be signed by the Clerk and the person who may be appointed Collector in room of Mr. Loghau resigned - Ordered that the request of The Commissioners be complied with when a Successor or Successors to Mr. Loghau may have been appointed.

From The Poor Law Commissioners 16. 1843 dated 21. July 1843. requesting the Clerk to furnish his account of Election Expenses as Returning Officer for the Union which the Clerk stated he had done.

From Return Jennings of Liverpool stating that having received a Government appointment he would be anxious to take out of the Workhouse his stepson John M. Dault provided the Board would pay his expenses to Liverpool it was ordered that Return Jennings be informed that the Board cannot appropriate the Union Funds to such a purpose.

From James DeLahunt dated 24<sup>th</sup> July 1843 - stating that he has 135 persons summoned for Poor Rates and resceues to the Killimore Petty Sessions since the 23<sup>rd</sup> of April last, and in consequence of the non-attendance of a second Magistrate these cases are adjourned every Court day, and requesting the Board to direct him how to act, as he cannot collect any Rate



until these cases are decided. Ordered that Captain Warburton Resident Magistrate at Ballinacree be communicated with on the subject of the foregoing letter, and in the event of Killimore not being in his district that a representation of the circumstances be made to the Under Secretary.
