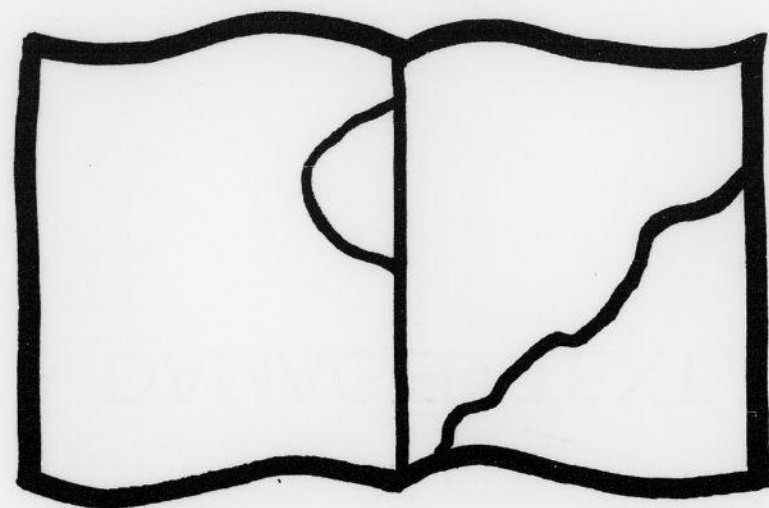

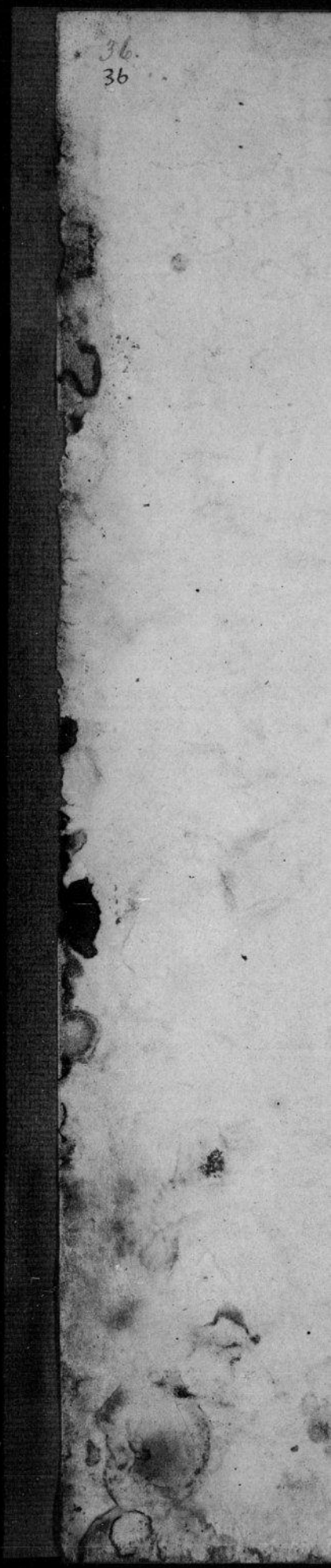

The Masters Journal was submitted to the Board by which it appeared that during the absence of the Matron and Schoolmistress, he had asked the Assistant Schoolmistress to give out milk for the Childrens dinner, and the food for the infant Children both of which she refused to do, and that she also refused to give any assistance in the management of the House, it also appeared from the Journal that the French School is not kept with that regularity and order so essential to its efficiency, that the Children are continually running thro' the House, and that no work has been done in it for some months passed and that the interference of the Board is required, and an enquiry asked for in order that these irregularities might be remedied, &c.

The Board having investigated the Complaints of the Master as above stated are of opinion that the Assistant Schoolmistress was not justified in refusing to obey the orders of the Masters or Matron on account of it bringing her into the Store Room where one of the Trustees was who she alleges had insulted her. To the Board she should have made her complaint - if any she

had to make.

The Board are further of opinion that the allegation, that the Assistant Schoolmistress refused to give any assistance in the management of the House is not proved.

The Board are further of opinion that the allegation, that the Children are not kept in the Schoolroom, but, allowed to go where they please that the Master had often remarked this, but that his directions were not attended to, is a complaint against the Schoolmistress, and that she admits its truth, but endeavours to throw the blame upon the Assistant Schoolmistress, in which the Board are of opinion she has not succeeded, in as much as that she brought no complaint of misconduct upon the part of the Assistant Schoolmistress before the Board, and in as much as that before she had the assistance she now has in the School, she had full time every to see that such neglect did not exist.

The Board are by no means satisfied with the conduct of either the Master, Matron, Schoolmistress, or Assistant Schoolmistress in this case, and feel quite sure that a due discharge of ^{their} duty by each would rectify all the evils complained of: and that such discharge of duty would result in a return to a regularity of work in the Girls School, so very necessary to the good of the Children therein, and the Board admonish these officers of the House to this due discharge of their respective parts of their severe displeasure.

The Board then having proceeded to the consideration of the Tenders to collect the Rates in Nos 3 & 4 districts, but for which there were no new proposals adjourned the ^{further} consideration of the matter till the 2nd of July next.
