Consultants' Fees
 Letter from the L. G. B. No. 53247 dated 21st September 1899 advertung to previous correspondence, and to the Guardians' Minutes of the 9th instant; and desiring to state that the result of the action taken by the Guardians in adopting an inadequate scale of fees under Article 23 of the Dispensary Rules would be that the sick poor might probably be deprived of Medical Advice or Surgical Assistance in cases involving serious danger to human life. The L. G. B. have therefore to request that, in view of the representations of the Medical Officers, the Guardians will be so good as to re-consider the matter. The Board have also to point out that the Medical Officers have the power under Article 21 of the Rules to call in extra professional assistance in difficult cases, and that unless a scale is in operation in the Union with the approval of the L. G. B., a Consultant may demand a very much larger fee than the Guardians would think reasonable.

The Guardians beg to inform the L. G. B. that the Board has been specially convened to consider this question on the 30th instant.
