With reference to the application of Mrs O'Reilly, Midwife, Caltra for payment of a fee of £1. for attenting on a woman, named Mrs Madden of Attiregan (entered on the Minutes of the 10th instant) in the absence of the Medical Officer and the Midwife the following explanation was read from Dr Egan, Medical Officer Killaan Dispensary District :-

"Kilconnell, 13th January, 1914.

" Dear Sir.

It has come as a surprise to me to learn that " I was absent when the woman, Mrs Madden of Attiregan, was ill. Not " only was I not absent but I actually attended the woman on the " occasion. You also state the ticket to Mrs O'Reilly was issued " on the 4th January, two days before the woman was ill. I attended " her on the 6th and again on the 7th and I saw no necessity for " Mrs O'Reilly. So in these circumstances if the man did send for " Mrs O'Reilly he should pay her himself. With regard to Mrs Daly, " the District Nurse, she was also laid up in her confinement at the " same time and I was also attending her so it was absolutely " impossible for her to be there. Under these circumstances I don't " see why the Guardians should entertain Mrs O'Reilly's application. (Signed) J. J. Egan."
