Board's Minute

Letter from the Local Government Board No. 37,173; 1915 dated the 9th. July, 1915 stating that they have had the Guardians Minutes before them of the 3rd. instant relative to the proposal to pay a fee to have an immate named John Bonlin bound as apprentice to a tailor; and, in reference thereto, the Board desire to draw attention to Section 1 (5) of the Pauper Children (Ireland) Act, 1898, and to state that as this boy is not an orphan or deserted the Guardians have no power to pay a fee for the purpose of apprenticing him.

Letter from the Local Government Board No. 33,286/1918 dated the 9th. July, 1915 referring to the Guardians Minutes of the 12th. ultimo to allow the wardsmaids in the Infirmary a temporary increase of two shillings (2/) a week in their wages; and, in reference thereto, the Board desire to point out that in only two cases, those of M. Casey, and M. Grey, do the applicants seem qualified, by length of service, for additions to their salaries, and in these cases, due notice of motion to consider the question should be given.
