August, 1915 adverting to the Guardians Minutes of the 17th. ultimo with which was forwarded a scale showing the alterations in the dietary of the inmates of the Workhouse which the Guardians proposed at their Meeting on the 5th. June last to adopt ; and that the Board desire to state that they decline to authorise the proposed changes in the dietary scale, which appear to have been framed in order to accommodate the meat contractor and with a disregard for the interests of the inmates. The Board have to point out that the Contractor should be called on to supply the necessary quantity of meat, and that if the supply is deficient it devolves upon the Master of the Workhouse to obtain the requisite amount from some other quarter, without regard to the cost, which is chargeable to the contractor. The Board have further to intimate that should the Master fail to discharge his duty in the particular, they will take serious notice of his conduct.

ORDERED/- THAT A SPECIAL MEETING BE CONVENED FOR THE 28th. INSTANT TO CONSIDER THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD'S LETTER, AND THAT THE CLERK GET COPIES OF THE NEW DIETARY SCALE FROM THE NEIGHBOURING UNIONS.
