The Council's Demand on the County Council should therefore be lessened by the amount of the Grant, which will be the same as last, and the County Council informed of this fact, and an amended Demand furnished them excluding therefrom the amount of the Exchequer Grant.

The Clerk states that the amount of the Grant in respect of this Council was only

£20.1.9. The Council do not think it necessary

The Board suggest that as only three of the sites included in the order have been confirmed by the Court, the Council, with a view to saving the expenses of Arbitration, might do well to endeavour to come to an agreement with the persons interested as to the price to be paid for the lands on the basis of the amounts recently awarded by the arbitrator.

The Clerk reported that the Dist Land Commission had lodged the 1st instalment of £5000 of the loan of £20850 sanctioned for the purpose of the Ballinasloe No 1 Rural District Labourers (Opposed) Order 1907. and that he had prepared the Treasurer's Advice Note for payment of the purchase money to the persons interested amounting to £2592. 13. 7 which was approved of and signed.
