Letter from the L.G.B. N^o L11772/12 dated 29th July 1908 forwarding this certificate as to the amount payable by the Council being costs of proving title in the case of Sir Henry G. Purkis Estate the amount was certified at £3.19.4

Letter from the L.G.B. N^o L11050/12 dated 29th July 1908 returning the plan, specification and estimate forwarded in relation to the proposal of the Council to acquire and repair an existing cottage in the townland of Ballydonagh under "The Ballinasloe N^o 1 Rural District Labourers (Unopposed) Order, 1904" and stating that in view of the price proposed to be paid for this Cottage, namely £60, the estimate of the Council's Engineer (£89.2.9) of the cost of providing an additional bedroom and executing general repairs to the existing structure seems very high, especially when compared with the provision made in the said Order in respect of the Order for the building of "new Cottages", namely, £120 each. The total expenditure in relation to this house, including the cost of the Gordon allotment and the proportion of the legal,

engineering and other incidental charges, would probably reach £180, which is higher than the Board would be prepared to sanction in the case of new cottages: and in the circumstances requesting that the Council will reconsider the matter with the view of reducing the estimated cost of the additions and repairs.

The Council desire to state that the contract for the masonry works to the boilage was taken at £20 under the Engineer's Estimate and it is calculated that the actual cost of the boilage was not over £164.

Letter from the L. G. D. AUTUMN QUARTERLY MEETING - 1908 .

TO THE BALLINASLOE RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

Mr Chairman and Gentlemen,

The roads in the Rural District were but indifferently attended to during the past quarter. The quarter's work which should have been completed early in September was, in most cases not commenced until ~~xxx~~ late in October, and although inspections were kept back until the last available moment, it was found in many cases that the work was but being commenced or very little progress made. Sufficient attention has not been paid to the matter of providing a sufficient supply of material on most roads, and this is one of the most important matters connected with road maintenance work. It may be taken as certain that contractors who fail to have a sufficient quantity of metal at the September inspection will have a poor starved road all the year round. On the other hand contractors who have got the proper supply ready at September are prepared at the advent of suitable weather to commence work immediately. On account of the Ballinasloe October fair, the edging was delayed in many cases, but in no case has money been deferred for want of edging. In this connection, it has

has been reported to you previously that it might be better to hold the Autumn meeting at a later date than October, say towards the end of November, as the season immediate preceding the October meeting is generally a busy one with the harvest for most contractors. The Loughrea District Council have approved of a resolution in favour of this arrangement and I believe it would have a very beneficial effect on the roads. As this is the season for repairing roads, contractors would be well advised to lose no time in getting a proper supply of materials and spreading them freely where required during any wet weather.

Bushes and hedges are a serious nuisance on some roads, and it will be necessary for contractors to serve notices on the responsible parties to have them properly trimmed and lopped, and to institute legal proceedings in cases where this is not done.

I would again remind contractors that an order recently made by the Local Government Board Auditor provides that no quarter's payment may be deferred twice; and that special works must be completed within six months of the time specified.

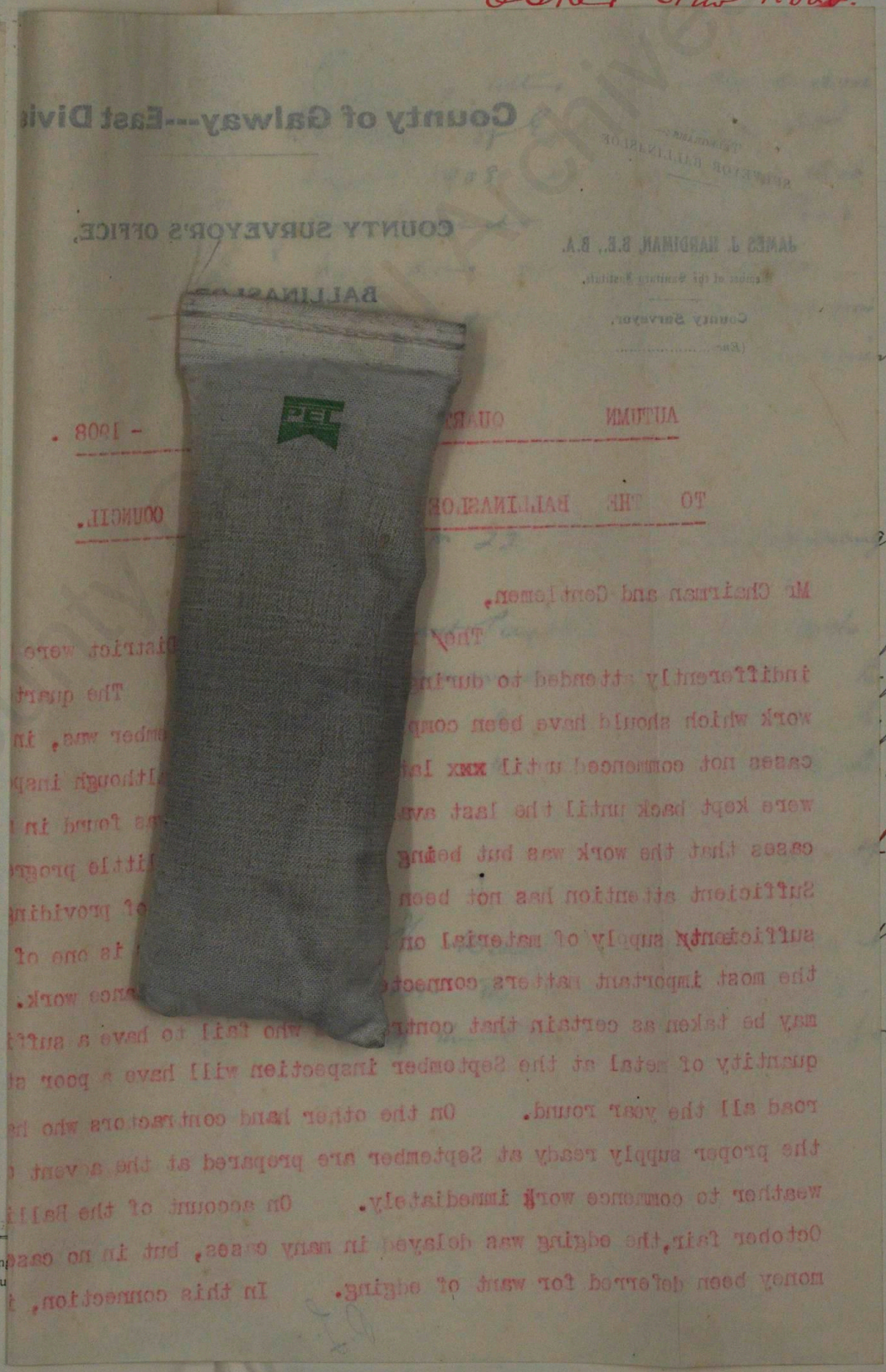
