WINTER QUARTERLY MEETING -- 1909.

TO THE RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL OF BALLINASLOE.

Mr Chairman and Gentlemen,

A fair amount of work has been done on most of the roads in the District but on the whole contractors have not taken full advantage of the suitable weather to properly sheet their roads so as to have them in good repair during the year. It has been repeatedly pointed out to contractors that almost all the year's supply of material should be spread between the 1st October and 31st March, as during this period the road crust is in a suitable condition to assimilate it, and metal spread during dry weather is both useless and a nuisance. The prevailing fault to be found with the methods of repair in the District is the substitution of dirty useless gravel for road metal. This causes the road surface to get rutted drilled and worn as the gravel is of no lasting benefit to the road and in most cases is converted into mud at the first shower of rain. There is a general tendency on the part of contractors to allow their roads to get narrow, and in some cases the working way is one or two feet short of

the specified width. This causes serious inconvenience to traffic, as on roads where the bushes and hedges are allowed to project, travelling becomes both unpleasant and dangerous. During the coming quarter, particular attention must be paid to have 1/2 all roads widened to the proper width, and all hedges cut to proper heights and thickness. Overhanging branches of a height less than fifteen feet above the road surface must be cut away, and as in the case of hedges proper notices must be served by the contractor of the occupiers of lands on which such hedges or trees grow. In case of non-compliance with these notices the contractor is bound to take proper legal steps to enforce the terms of the notice, and he will be held responsible for all hedges and overhanging branches not cut to proper heights before the 31st March. Road drainage is practically neglected in the district, and outlets in nearly all cases are of no use to the road. Side and back drains should be cleared out to a depth sufficient to remove all surface water immediately from the road surface, and contractors are bound to make adjoining landholders clear drains leading through their lands when such is necessary for the proper drainage of the road.

Except in cases of extreme urgency no broken stones should be used for road repair during the Summer half year that is from the 1st April

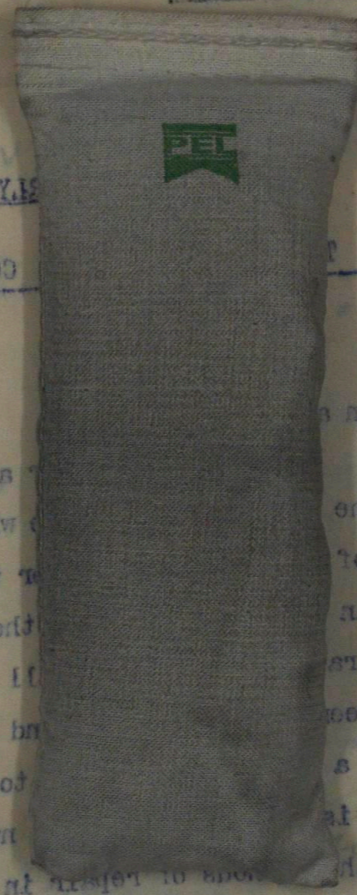
