On a good many of the reads nothing has been done: whilst en others the material supplied for read metal is of such a perishable nature that the present severe weather has almost removed the idle handiwork of the trafficker in inferior metal. naint of view! because it lightens, if

Sand has again been much in evidence as read sheeting - sand mixed with an occasional pebble. Contractors have repeatedly warned against the use of such rubbish on their roads, and in future severest measures will be taken against centracters en whose reads it is found. of dry weather.

As a consequence of this neglect I am serry that a considerable by amount of money is deferred, and as all the inspections for the coming quarter must close at the end of March, I would urge the centractors to go to work at once and spare me the unpleasant operation of having to "strike-eff"these deferred amounts at the next April meeting.

The 31st March being the end of the Financial year, all payments in respect of reads will have to be finally settled. New I hope the centractors concerned may see the importance attaching to the work of the next six weeks — and more especially these who have allowed the last three menths to pass by without making any definite effort to do the work which they have agreed to.

And how easy it is where the contractor is willing to do away with all the incessant trouble pertaining to these quarterly meetings. One hundred or fifty or thirty tens of broken stones or whatever the quantity may be, supplied on the readside ends all the trouble — and places the contractor in a position of comparative independence.

The improvement of the reads during these two menths is of paramount importance from another point of view: because it lightens, if not altegethed dispenses with, Summer work on the reads, and at the same time agreeably affects the Surveyor's certificate, during the Summer season. All contractors know that if a read be not made now, it will be a matter of the greatest difficulty to make it after the advent of dry weather.

Throughout the District there are many hedges which are highly injurious to the several reads. The proper notices should new be served into the owners of such, and I would ask contractors so affected to send me the names and addresses of such owners or occupiers. Where hedges are cut, the therms should be immediately removed from the read surface.

All materials at present lying on the readside should be spread before the end of the present menth: where this is not den e a fine will be impesed. Shoets should not contain less than half-a-ton: this is particularly desirable on Main reads. The contractors should avoid "thin" careless spreading, for next in importance to supplying an adequate amount of suitable material, is the proper and judicious use of it in repairing the read surface.

Read Drainage, - This item of read maintenance has been very much neglected; centractors should see that the cutlets particularly en slopes are kept clean, and that the back drains and water tables are in proper working order.

When "starters" appear on the read surface it is a certain indication that sufficient material has not been supplied, and the Surveyer in his reports pays particular attention to the existence of this defect.

There is an application before you "to make a drain to take the water from the weighbridge at Kilconnell." My estimate for the work is £7. However I censider it is not a work which could legally be undertaken by the Council.
