Dear Sir,

I beg to report that having heard of the sale of Milk at Lismany by some of the Labourers wives, I visited the place and having made inquiries I found that three of them; Mrs. Deaton, Gate Lodge, Mrs. Mariner, and Mrs. Lyons, were in the habit of selling small quantities to their neighbours.

They have no Dairies and the milk is usually kept in the Kitchens, and is liable to contamination by impure air, otherwise the premises are clean and the water supply is good.

Mr. Michael Donohue, Bellview, and Mr. McCracken,
Lismany, have registered one cow each for the sale of milk.
Their Premises are in good Order, and require no alteration.

On a former occasion I informed the Council of the dirty condition of some Churns used for the conveyance of milk I find that Martin Fahey of Kilolooney has made no effort to comply with the necessary requirements, and I think a reprimand from the Council is desireable.

With few exceptions the half-yearly limesashing has been carried out, and I expect will be completed in a few days.

I find no disease in any of the Cows.

Mr Chairman and Contlemen, to the the parties of the case

I cannot yet report any treat improvement in the general condition of the reads in the Ballinasloe Rural District.

A good lot of work has, however, been done: and a great lot will depend now on the contractors' seriousness in facing the terms of their contracts and carrying out that one simple essential viz,— the supply in full of the annual specified amount of material.

There are a number of contracts on the other hand on which little or no work has been done during the past three, and in some cases, six menths. I hope the contractors who have thus neglected their work may make a start now and get ready the matrial for the coming year. By doing so they will spare those responsible the unpleasant duty of instituting proceedings. On the contractor depends altogether the harmonious working of the contract system; and on harmonious and carnest working depends the improvement and efficient maintenance of the reads.

On roads where a plantiful supply was put out, contractors should attend better to the surfacing, and removal from the surface of loose drills of unconsolidated metal. The period of spreading was somewhat

There are a number of contracts on the other hand on which little or no work has been done during the past three, and in some cases, six months. I hope the contractors who have thus neglected their work may make a start now and get ready the material for the coming year. By doing so they will spare those responsible the unpleasant duty of instituting proceedings. On the contractor depends altogether the harmonious working of the contract system; and on harmonious and carnest working depends the imprevement and efficient maintenance of the reads.

On roads where a plantiful supply was put out, contractors should attend better to the surfacing, and removal from the surface of loose drills of unconsolidated metal. The period of spreading was somewhat
