No doubt some of the contracts were taken with the intention of supplying only the starvation minimum, - this meant high profits and a low standard of maintenance - whereas a fairly high standard of maintenance, by reducing the profits, also reduced thee contractor's inclination to carry out his contract. This latter standard is fully laid down in each road specification: and the first principle in any business transaction is to pay due regard to the terms agreed on by the parties therein concerned. I am bound by such specification, and where the contractor chooses to

disregard it, steps to enforce the compact become an absolute necessity. In the general condition of the roads in the District I cannot report very much improvement. The work of the coming quarter may, however, lead to better results. In the judicious spreading of the material much may be done in improving the bare and bad portions of the roads, in raising the centres of hollow hills, and bringing the road to the proper cross section. Where the contracts include the streets of towns, contractors will be expected to put such streets in decent order by a generous sheeting of good sound material. They will also be required or compelled to pay more attention in future to the maintenance of the footpaths included in their contracts.

During the present quarter, contractors should take steps ---(1) to have high boundary hedges pruned or cut: and the branches of trees lopped where necessary.
