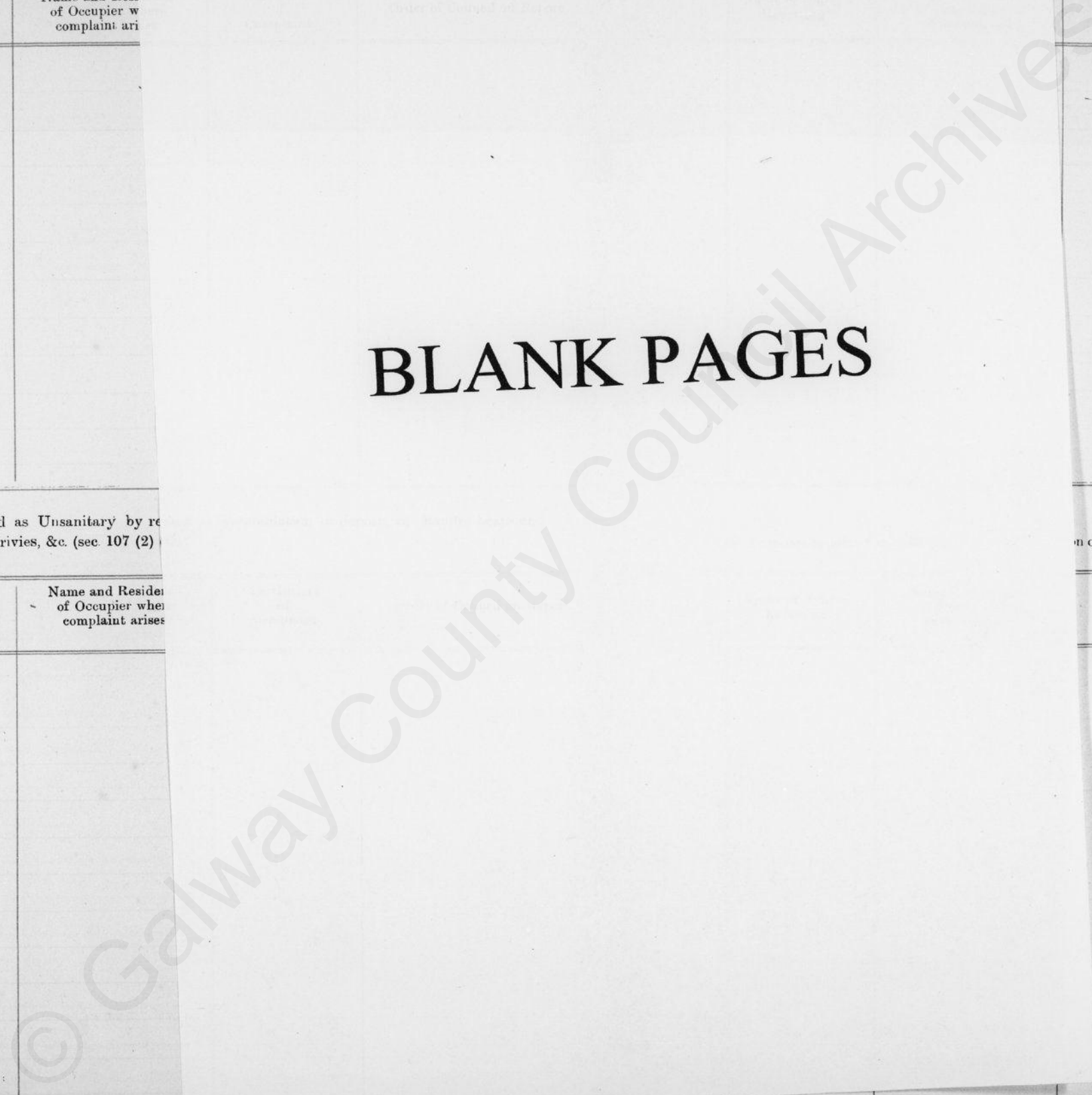

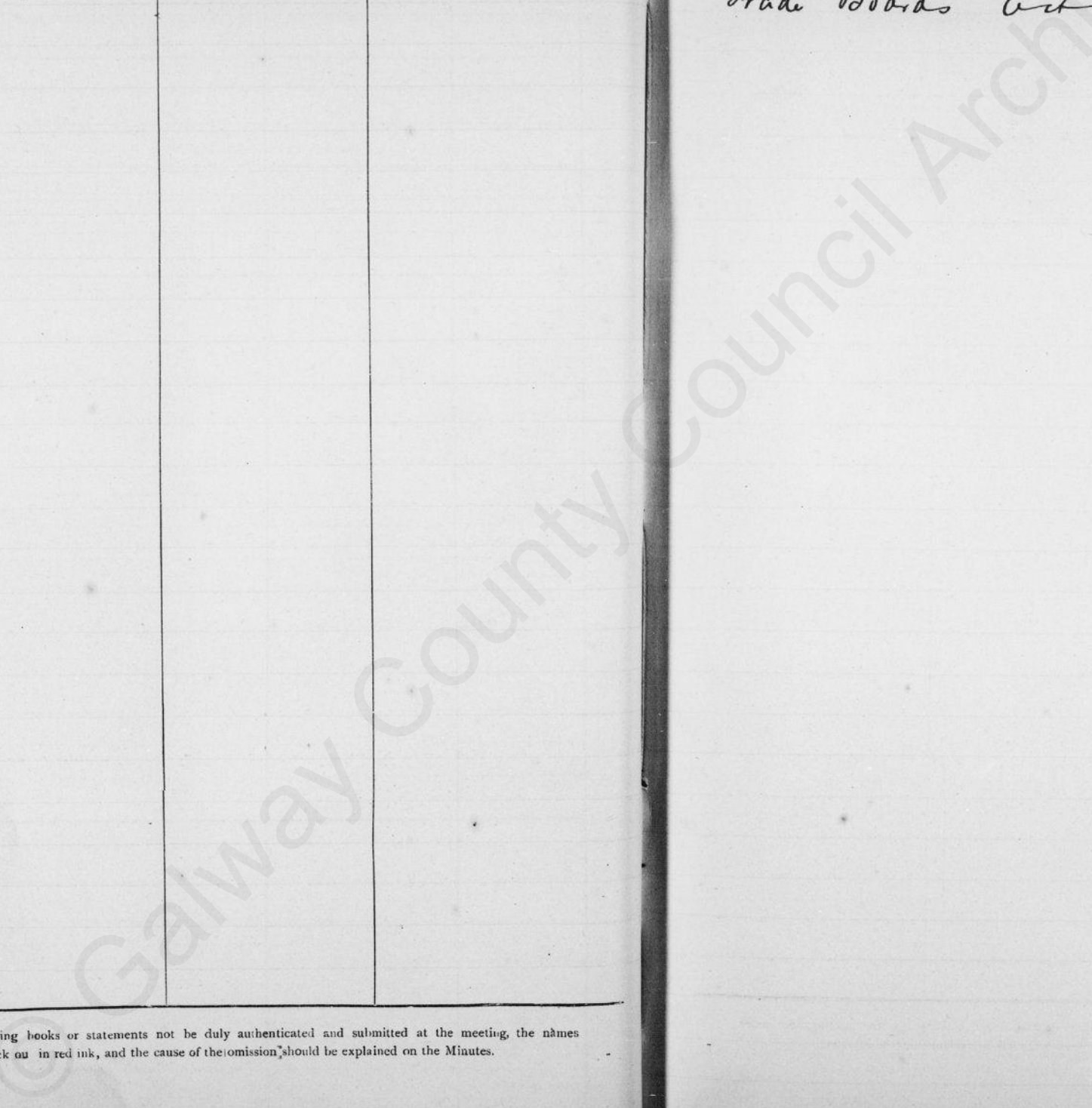

Water Supplies

✓ Letter from Med. O. B. No. 52941 dated 13th August 1910 referring to the Clerk's letter of the 5th inst and to the entry in the minutes of the 30th ultimo in connection with the Council's application for sanction to a loan for the purpose of sinking Wells and erecting pumps at Ballymanagh, Esvallough, Kellure and Gorteenaveela; and stating that before further considering the application it is necessary that they should be furnished with ✓ fuller reports from the Medical Officers of Health of the districts concerned as to the possibility of pollution of the water in each case; and pointing out that no expenditure should be incurred in respect of the works until the loan has been authorised by the Treasury.

The Clerk stated that he communicated with the Medical Officers of Health on the subject of the Board's letter, and read the following reports :-

- I beg to report that I have inspected the sites selected
- for the Wells and Pumps at Ballymanagh and Gorteenaveela, and
- I am of opinion that there is no risk of pollution of the water
- in either case. At Gorteenaveela and also at Ballymanagh there
- is no drain or cesspool in proximity to the well and no risk
- of surface washings entering it when protected near the surface
- by cement. At Gorteenaveela there is no house in proximity to
- the site. At Ballymanagh there is a house and yard within 20
- yards of the site, but it is not a possible source of pollution
- as it lies below the well in the movement of the ground water.

No doubt some of the contracts were taken with the intention of supplying only the starvation minimum,— this meant high profits and a low standard of maintenance — whereas a fairly high standard of maintenance, by reducing the profits, also reduced the contractor's inclination to carry out his contract. This latter standard is fully laid down in each road specification: and the first principle in any business transaction is to pay due regard to the terms agreed on by the parties therein concerned. I am bound by such specification, and where the contractor chooses to disregard it, steps to enforce the compact become an absolute necessity.

In the general condition of the roads in the District I cannot report very much improvement. The work of the coming quarter may, however, lead to better results. In the judicious spreading of the material much may be done in improving the bare and bad portions of the roads, in raising the centres of hollow hills, and bringing the road to the proper cross section. Where the contracts include the streets of towns, contractors will be expected to put such streets in decent order by a generous sheeting of good sound material. They will also be required or compelled to pay more attention in future to the maintenance of the footpaths included in their contracts.

During the present quarter, contractors should take steps ---

- (1) to have high boundary hedges pruned or cut: and the branches of trees lopped where necessary.

On about half your roads there was no work done during the quarter ending the 30th September. There is therefore a considerable amount of deferred money, and in extreme cases of neglect money already deferred has been struck-off.

Some of your contractors have made very substantial efforts in the matter of supply; but in almost every case there remains a balance of material still due to the road. I hope however to be able to secure this deficiency during the ensuing quarter.

In nearly all cases where material has been supplied, great difficulty has been encountered in accurately ascertaining the amount thereof,— proper depots not having been formed, and the stones being often laid down in heaps of every varying size and shape. In not a few cases the heaps have been dressed innocently over high margins. The proper way is no doubt also the easiest, viz,— putting down the stones in 20-ton heaps in depots formed along the road margins. 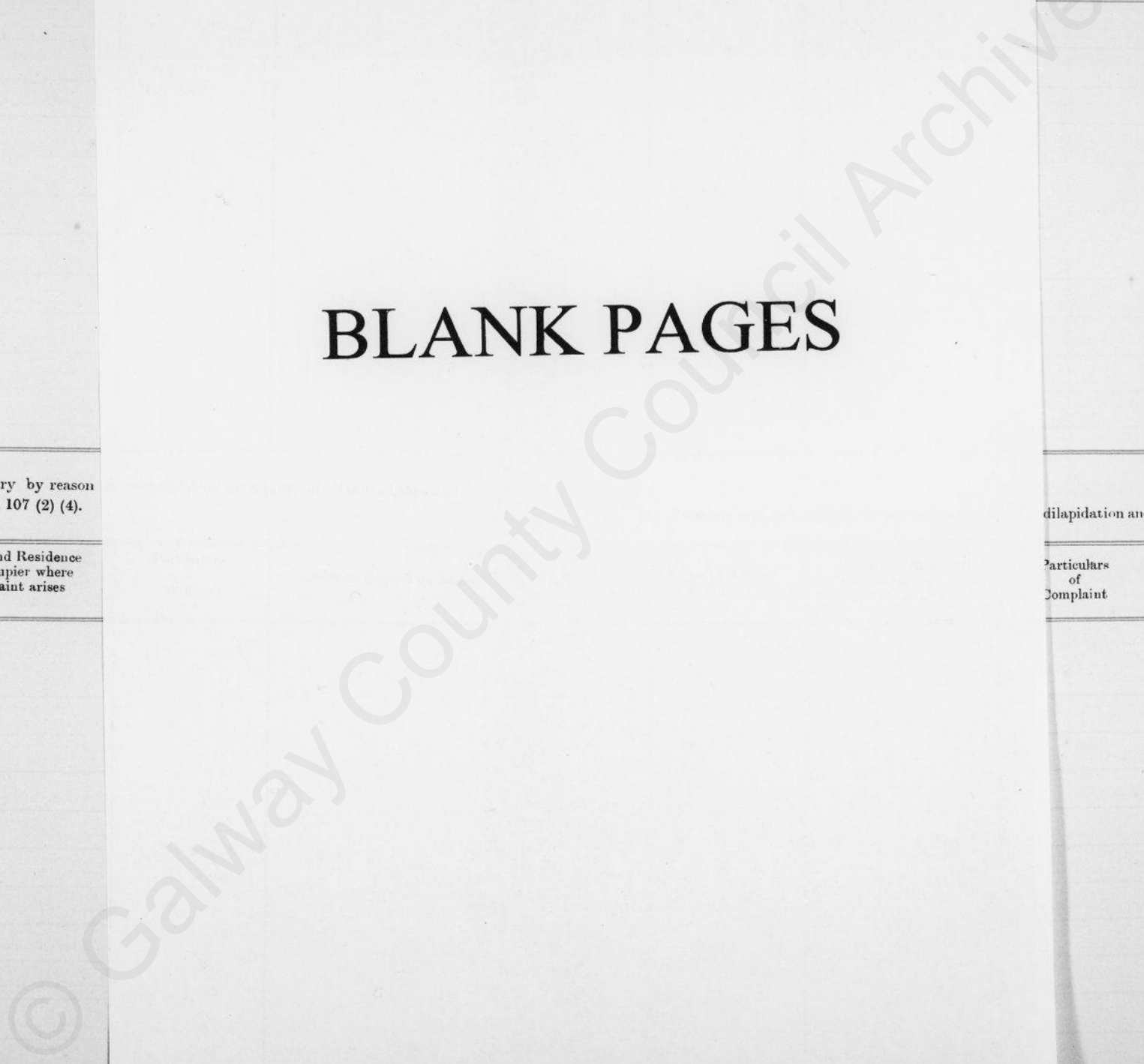
