Killaan Burial Ground

A letter was read from Lord Ashdown dated the 24th September 1910 granting the Council permission to enter the Killaan Burial Ground to clean it and kill the rabbits on the following conditions

- (1) that the grave yard is cleaned before the rabbits are killed
- (2) that traps are placed in the holes.

The Council agrees to allow £1 and the rabbits for the cleaning of the grave yard also 5/- for car to launch the rabbits.

- (1) That the drain leaving Mrs. McCallan's land from the Kilconnell Sewer requires cleaning very badly. The S.S.O. to get this drain cleaned at a cost not to exceed £2.

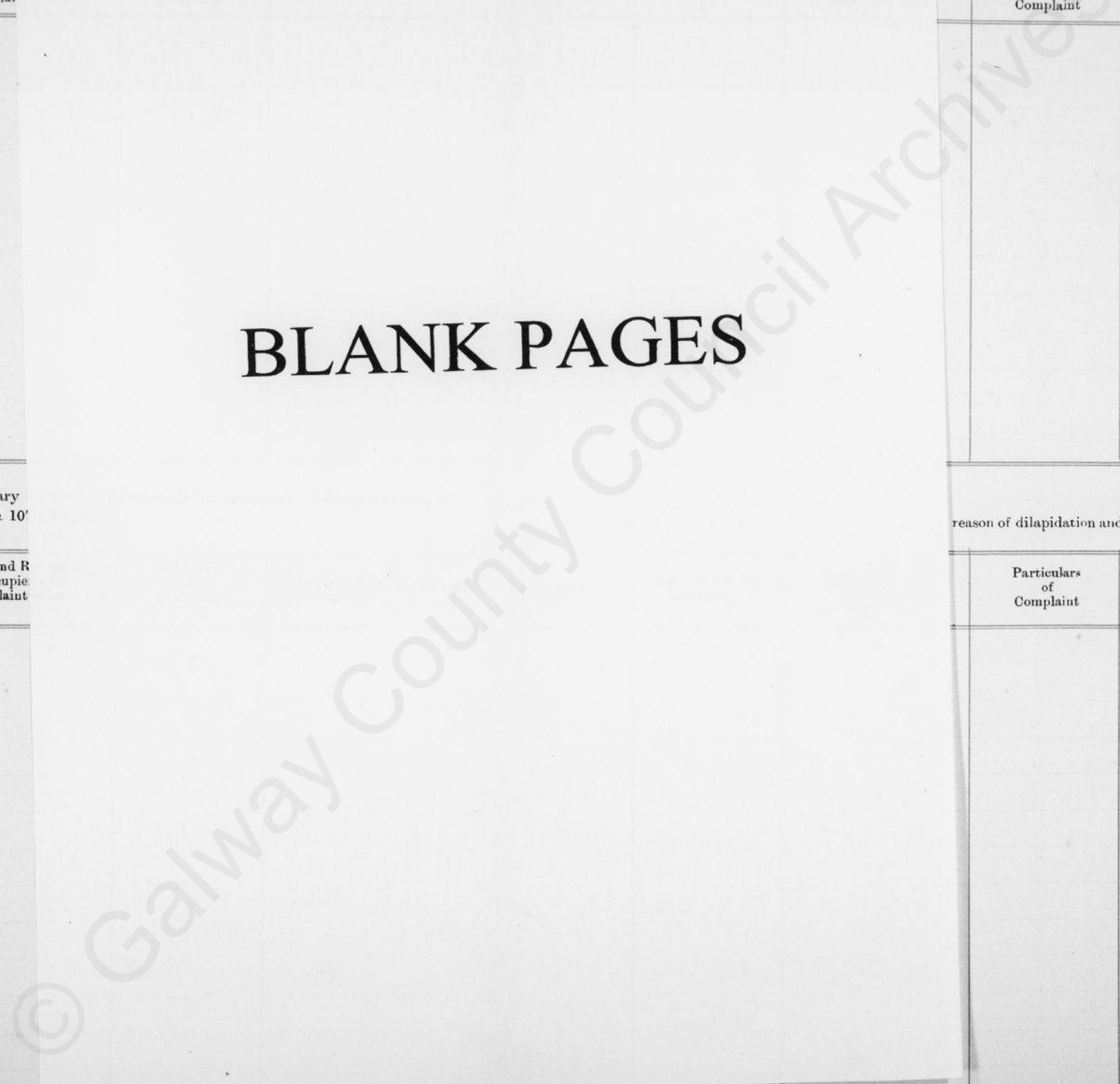

Read a letter from David Craig dated 22nd November 1910 stating that he has not been paid for the two plots 40 and 44 taken at Oghilmore of which he is the occupier

Letter from Dr David Craig dated 24th November 1910 acknowledging the receipt of the Clerk's letter and stating that he is amazed at the action of the Arbitrator, and he must know by whose Authority he took such liberty with his (Dr Craig's) absolute right as Occupier of the lands of Oghilmore for over 21 years; and asking that the matter be brought before the Council

Read the following which was signed by 38 Labourers 27 of whom are occupiers of Labourers Cottages:-

"To the Ballinacloe District Council
" We, the undersigned Labourers from the Divisions of
" Kylesmore and Lawrencetown, hereby give notice that we
