Letter from the L. C. B. No. 16576/12 dated 2nd December 1910 forwarding to be laid before the Council a letter which has been received from a man named Martin Kelly, relative to the cottage in course of erection for him under the Labourers Acts; and requesting that the Board may be furnished with a report from the Council's Engineer as to the alleged defective construction of this cottage.

The Clerk stated that he communicated with Mr Kempster on receipt of the foregoing letter and that Mr Kempster replied as follows:-

Ballinasloe 14th December, 1910.

re Cottage No 138 O.S. 99 (Killoran).

Sir,

I beg to state that I inspected the above Cottage for a final certificate on the 15th November and found it in a proper condition. I always make the contractor place the door sill so that the door oversails the sill by about $\frac{3}{4}$ th of an inch which I consider makes a neater finish and is quite as effectual as a weather board. I have found it useless to put down paved channels as most of the tenants cultivate the land right up the cottage walls. There was no trace of damp in any room when I was there although the weather was very broken at the time. Although this Cottage was handed over four months before my final inspection it had not been inhabited. There was no furniture in the house. I found two women winnowing oats in the kitchen and the other rooms used as a granary. With regard to the fence Martin Kelly brought an action against the District Council at the October 1909 Quarter Sessions to recover £6. for damages to his crop caused as he stated by imperfect fencing which action was dismissed by the County Court Judge. The Contractor (James Whelan) told me afterwards that hearing Kelly was complaining of the fence he offered to make good anything that he objected to but that he (Kelly) refused to allow him to touch it as he said that he would make something out of the Council.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

Mr Chairman and Gentlemen,

A considerable number of your contractors have ~~neg~~ neglected their roads for the past quarter: and consequently, in these cases, the money has been deferred. In some instances there has been an earnest endeavour to do good work, which if continued, must eventually lead to satisfactory roads. It is therefore of the utmost importance that during the present month, and up to the middle of February, the work of surface repairs by sheeting, where left unfinished, should be continued: and in cases where little or nothing has been done, contractors might reasonably make a final effort to earn the deferred amounts before it is gone past the work season.

It seems inexplicable that contractors should be so blind to their own interests as not to put their roads ~~once~~ ^{and for all} into thorough repair, and once they had achieved ~~the~~ ^{this} object how easy would the subsequent work become - how satisfactory to the public - how satisfactory to all concerned!

I hope therefore that these deferred monies may be earned before the next quarterly meeting. Inspections will commence about the middle of February and the sheeting and surface repairs should be completed by this time.

Contractors should not forget the footpaths repairs - a neglected footpath on a contract will be considered a serious defect if not repaired before next inspection, and will be treated accordingly.

Injurious fences, interfering with the traffic, are still in evidence. Where reported bad on next inspection, a quarter's money will be deferred in consequence. It is surprising what little respect is accorded the public highway by those who derive from it the most benefit.

A proposal to repair a stop-ended road in Ballymacward is before you; I am of opinion that the proposal cannot be passed, - the road is not the required 16 feet between fences. However if the Council pass the work, it will require £100 to complete. To repair at existing width would cost £35. No. 55. Outfield ~~new~~ Road - my estimate would be £1 per perch or total of £652.

In some instances there has been no work done at all, and in others it has been deferred. It is therefore of the utmost importance that the work should be completed by the middle of February, the work being by sheeting, where left unfinished, should be continued: and the little of nothing has been done, and the contractors might reasonably be expected to earn the deferred amount before it is too late to do so. It seems inexplicable that contractors should be so negligent of their own interests as not to put their roads once and for all in a satisfactory state, and once they had achieved this object how easy would the subsequent work be. I am therefore of opinion that the work should be completed by the middle of February, and that the contractors should be treated accordingly.

I hope therefore that these deferred matters may be dealt with at the next quarterly meeting. Inspections will commence about the middle of the month, and the sheeting and surface repairs should be completed by that time. Contractors should not forget the footpaths, and the footpaths should be considered a serious defect in the roads, and will be treated accordingly.

Inquiries have been made, interfering with the traffic, and where reported on next inspection, a quarter's money will be withheld. It is surprising what little respect is accorded to the Highway Act by those who derive from it the most benefit.

A proposal to repair a stop-ended road in Ballinacorney Rural District cannot be passed, - the road is in a state of disrepair, and the cost of the repairs is estimated at £100. It is therefore of opinion that the proposal cannot be passed, and that the road should be left as it is, and that the cost of the repairs should be met by the Local Government Board.

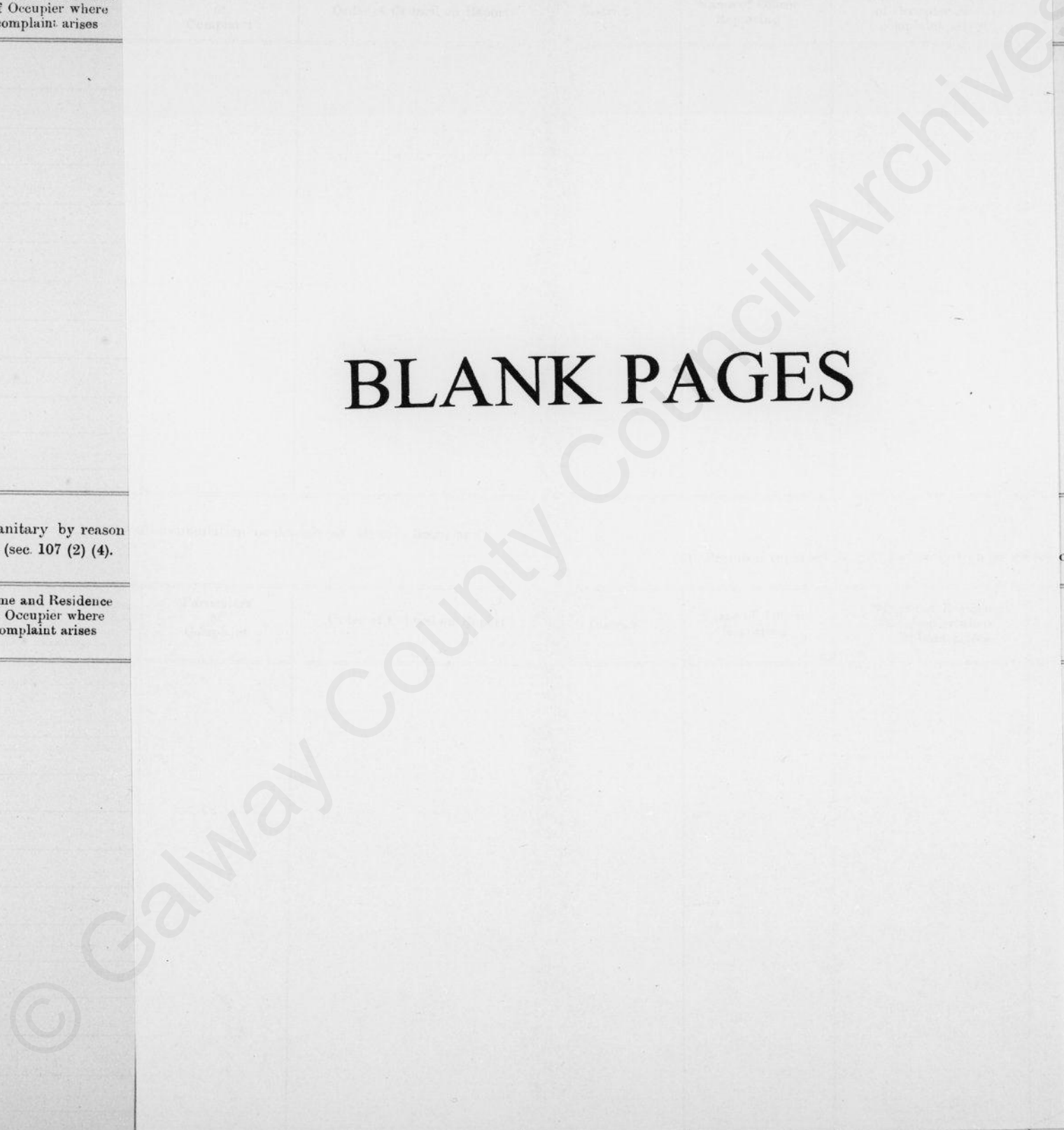

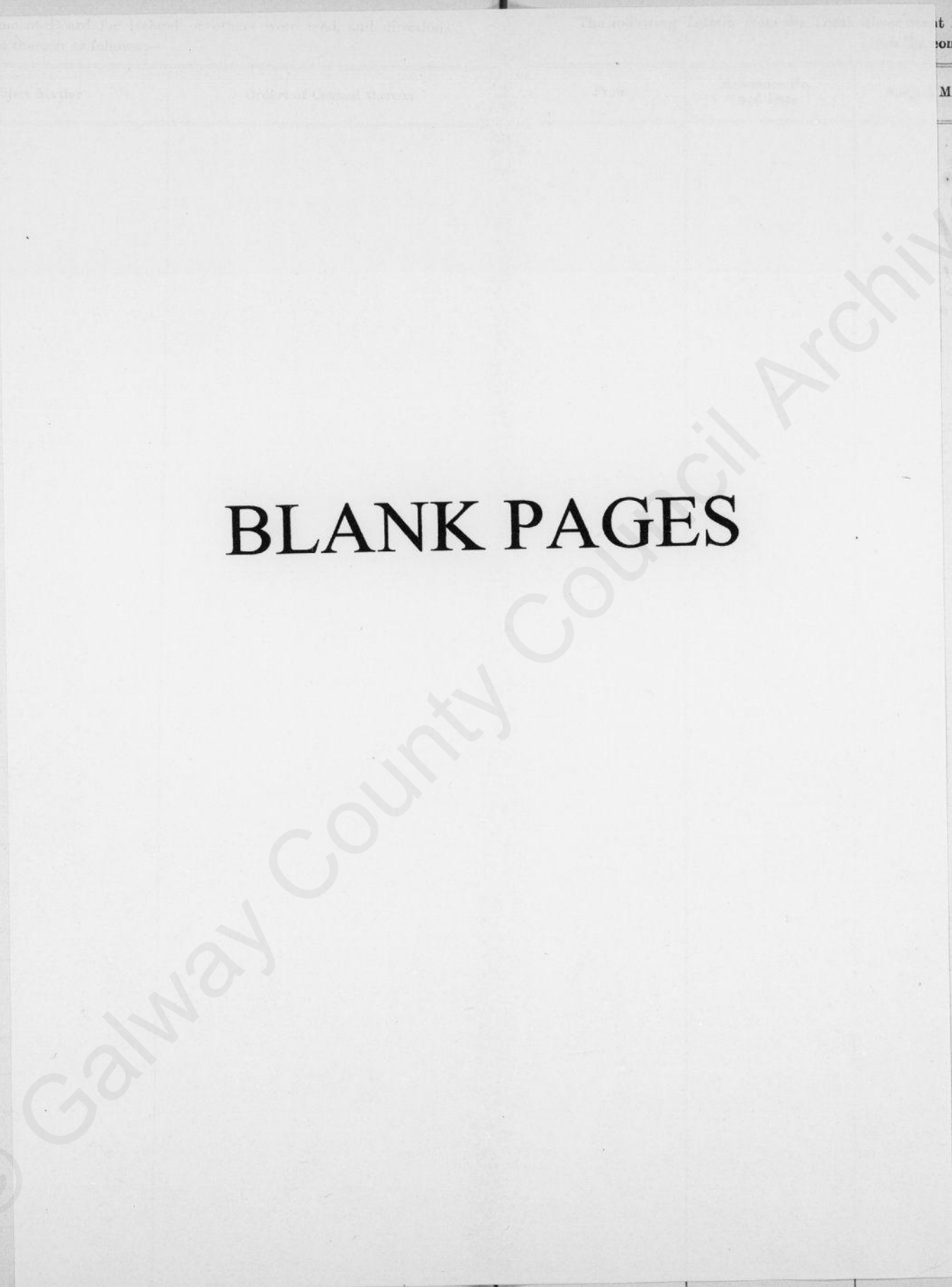
