His. The Lord Lieutenant, for the distribution of the unexpended shares of certain Counties in the residue of the Exchequer Contribution under the Purchase of Land (Ireland) Act 1891 which accrued up to the commencement of the Labourers Act 1906. The Regulations provide that the share of each County shall be distributed from time to time amongst the several Rural Districts comprised in the County, having regard to the amount of interest or annuities paid or payable by each Rural District Council to the Irish Land Commission in respect of advances made to such Council in pursuance of section 16 of the Act of 1906. The sum so paid or payable by the Council up to the 1<sup>st</sup> December last is £1278.9.3, and an order for payment of this amount has, accordingly, been remitted to the Secretary of the County Council to be placed to the credit of the District Council. The total share of the County was £5131.15.9 and the amount now remitted to the County Council in respect of all the Rural Districts comprised in the County which obtained Loans from the Land Commission under the Act of 1906 is £3719.2.1 leaving a balance of £1412.13.8 for future distribution.
