S. Govin acting Medical Officer of Health in the Lawrencetown Dispensary District reported the occurrence of 5 cases of enteric fever at Coolcarta, Lisbeg and Lisnamony in the Lawrencetown Disp. Dist. All the cases have been removed to Hospital and the houses disinfected.

The S. S. O (Belconnor) reported that he places disinfected and the clothing removed for disinfection at the Workhouse. The people require the water of the District to be analysed.

Mr. Egan, Dairy Inspector reported as follows:-

I beg to state that having heard of an outbreak of fever in the neighbourhood of Lawrencetown, reported to be attributable to the milk supply, I visited that District on Tuesday the 19th instant, and made the fullest inquiry.

I found that at Mr. Mather's Farm Yard, at Coolcarta milk was being sold to the residents of Lisbeg House and to some others living in the Vicinity.

I inspected Mr. Mather's Dairy and found it more of the nature of a lumber room than a Dairy, also it being stuffy on account of the windows being closed against ventilation, there were some pans of milk and cream in it at the time, I cautioned the man in charge against any further distribution, I am also to state that Mr. Mather's is not registered for the sale of milk.

There is a pump in the yard from which the water for cleansing the Dairy utensils is taken, and from its position I think it possible for liquid matter from the surrounding yard and cowsheds to enter it.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

Mr Chairman and Gentlemen,

The work done on your roads during the past quarter has been very small; the payments ~~xxx~~ recommended are small also. Several of your district roads have during the last six or more months been allowed to be derelict; prosecutions against the contractors and their sureties have been ordered in the worst cases.

The quantity of material so far supplied is far from satisfactory - and unless during the coming month (say up to the middle of November) this defect is remedied, we cannot hope for much improvement in the condition of the road surfaces. In order to give contractors an opportunity of completing the work of supply, and at the same time getting credit for same, I shall have the next quarterly inspections commenced on the 15th, November. Immediately after this inspection, when the quantity of material will be again estimated, the road should be thoroughly sheeted, hollow hills made up, and bare and weak portions improved with a strong, substantial, coating of material.

Now, with reference to the quarter beginning in next January, the usual custom of inspections will also be departed from. The inspections will commence about the middle of January when the reports will deal altogether with the amount of sheeting done - and when all the material should be used up on the road surface. Of course in special cases of heavy main roads it may be advisable to keep over a small proportion of the material for Spring repairs but on most of the district roads and many main roads any spreading done after the winter season is absolute waste of energy.

This re-arrangement of the dates of inspections - which I would ask the contractors to take particular note of - has been considered necessary in order to throw the weight of the road work into the Winter months, when the comparative slackness of farming operations presents a favourable opportunity for the carrying out of such works.

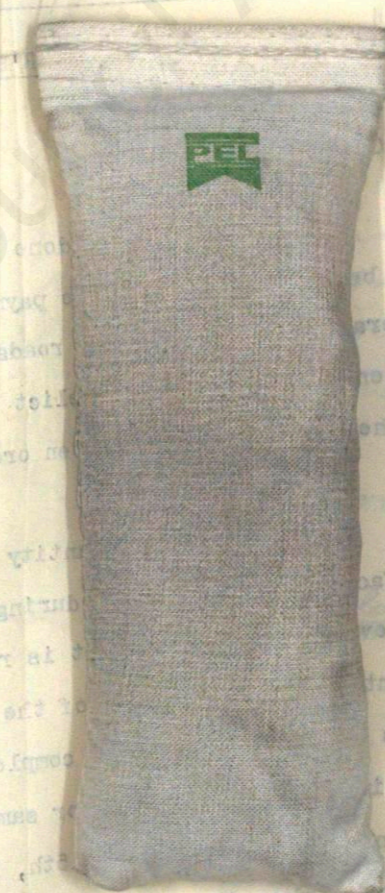

The Board would propose that if this water supply is intended to be provided for the common benefit of both Dispy Districts (Balmastoe and Kiltormer Dispy Districts) the cost thereof should be apportioned jointly on those Dispy Districts, as was recently done by the Board, with the Council's consent, in the case of the Ballydonagh Pump: and adding that the Bd have given instructions for the issue of area of charge orders, as desired by the Council for the Pumps at Killeeney and Kylemore.

The Council agree to have the Dispy Districts of Balmastoe and Kiltormer to form the Area of Charge as suggested by the L. G.P.

Lawrencetown Drains

D. Faus. M. O. H. reported that owing to the bad state of the drains at Lawrencetown some of the yards in the upper part of the town are in an unsanitary state: and steps should be taken to have the drains properly cleaned.

Referred to the local Councilors for a report.

Kilcornell Sewers

D. Egan M. O. H. reported that the two gullies at Kilcornell Cross in connection with the Sewers are entirely blocked up and unable to carry any water, also that portion of the sewer leading from these gullies and through Mr. Hession's garden seems blocked with the result that it floods Mr. Hession's yard and Stables and also Mrs. Egan's house: and recommending that all these be opened and cleaned.
