



The Clerk reported that since last meeting he had been served with a process at the instance of Mr Kempster against the Council for the Gort Quarter Sessions on the 15th instant, for the sum of £40.11.6 fees under the Labourers Acts and for pumps. That he handed the Process to Mr Hayden to defend.

APPROVED OF.

After some discussion as toowhether the Council would pay the amount in face of the letter of the Local Government Board No 650/12 dated the 19th January last, it was ultimately decided that Mr Hayden attend at Gort Quarter Sessions on the 15th instant and apply to have the case adjourned to the Loughrea Quarter Sessions so as to enable the Council to enter a Cross Civil Bill against Mr Kempster for damages in negligently certifying for payments and wrongly measuring plots.

Read a letter from the Rent Collector, Mr Daniel Connolly, asking the Council to allow him some reasonable remuneration for extra duty performed by him, at the request of Mr Hayden, the Council's Solr, since September last in connection with the serving of notices &c for legal proceedings against tenants of Labourers Cottages not living in the Cottages.
