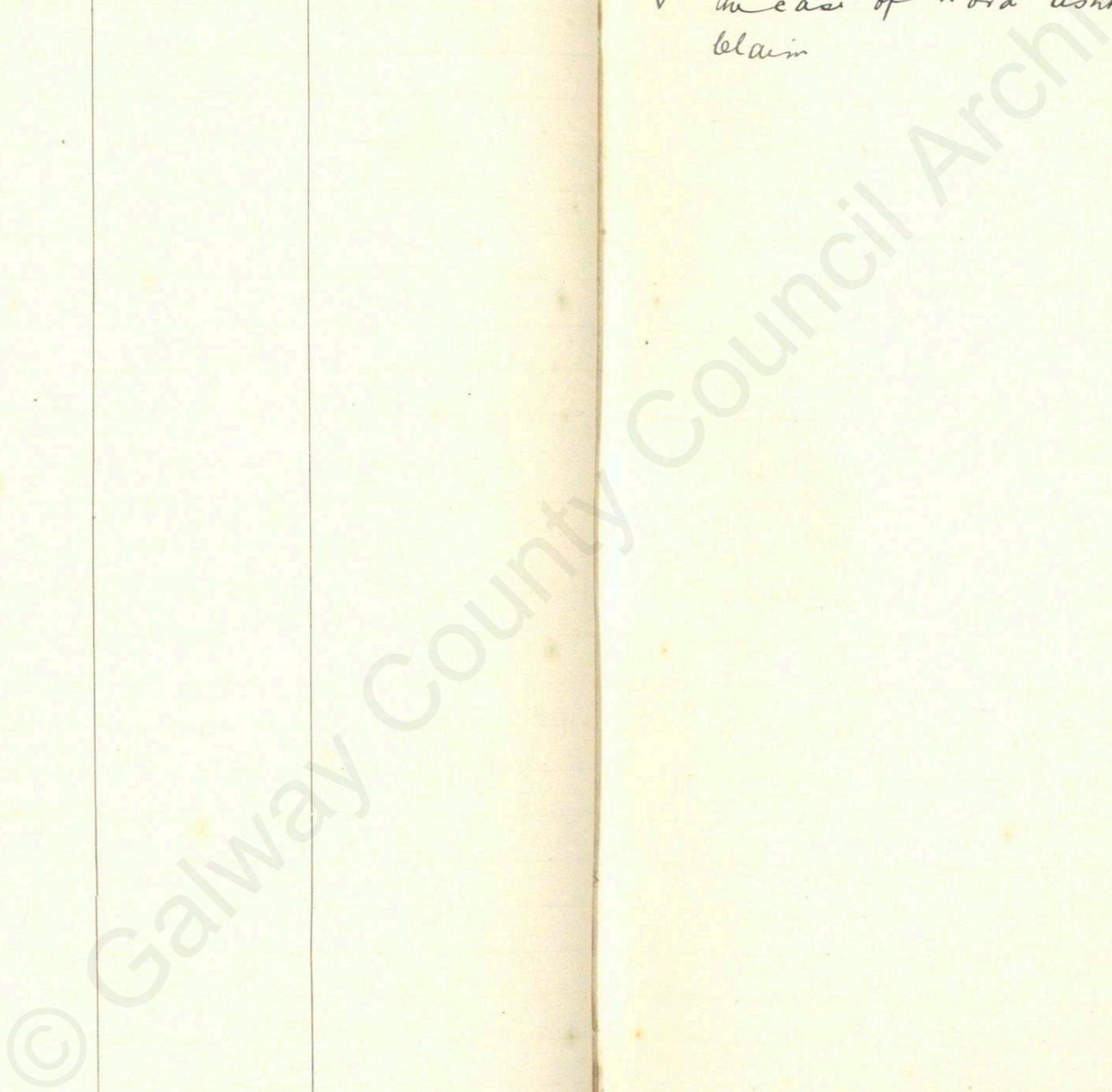

✓ Dr. Egan, M.O.H. Meleagh Dispy Dist reported that the House of Martin Glynn of Gortnahoon is very unsanitary and in fact dangerous to live in. It requires thatching and binwashing. The parties are very poor.

✓ He also reported that a Well at Ballyboggan, from which the people of that village get water, seems very bad at present, but if cleaned and protected it may be fairly good.

✓ Dr. Fair, M.O.H. Laurencetown Dispy Dist reported the occurrence of four cases of Enteric fever in his District. The source of infection cannot be ascertained; the patients are isolated as much as possible, stools and utensils are disinfected and the nature of the sources of infection explained.

✓ He also reported that the surroundings of the pump at Laurencetown are in an unsanitary state, and should be cleaned as soon as possible.

Ordered / I write to the Landlord on this matter and his attention called to Glynn's House.

Referred to the S.S.O. Mr. Hession for a report.

Mr Chairman and Gentlemen,

Although there is some improvement in the general condition of your roads, there are yet a considerable number of which the surfaces are still rough and uneven, and which are consequently in need of a plentiful sheeting of road material next season. This refers particularly to the main roads; and I would ask your contractors to bear in mind the importance of the condition the full specified amount should be laid down on the roadside by the 1st September next.

As yet, the amount of material prepared is inconsiderable, and it will take the contractors for the coming few months to work hard to secure the required tonnage. Last season the material was generally supplied late, and the result of late spreading became a nuisance to the public in a good many cases. In future there will be only one measurement made of the material, and the value of any deficiency in the supply will be deducted from the quarterly amount available.

In a good many cases, particularly in the district roads, the trimming of the margins has been neglected, with the result that the working way has become narrow, and the facilities for efficient drainage much impaired. The outlets, too, in many cases have been allowed to silt up, and the consequence is that the road surfaces have suffered considerably during rainy weather. For such neglect deductions have been made from the
