Mr Chairman and Gentlemen,

The specified quantity of material has not been supplied on any of your roads this ~~financial~~ Season.

A fair attempt, however, has been made in most cases; and this is particularly noticeable on the Main roads. For the deficiency in each case I have deferred a proportion of the available money - this money will be struck off next Quarter unless in the meantime the contractor does the work required of him. The County Council has ordered that each contractor shall get a written notice of the defects for which money has been now deferred. These notices will be sent out in the course of a few days. Let the contractors comply with their requirements and all available money will be paid next time.

Road No. 22- (Mc Donnell's). I would ask your Council to give authority for the expenditure of a sum of £40 on this Main road. A decree for this amount has been obtained against the contractor and his sureties, and it is necessary that you should approve of this expenditure.

I would recommend the filling of Two Hollows on Road No. 21, at a cost of £ 12 (Twelve)

I have estimated the following sums for the maintenance of the roads in your District for the financial year ending on 31st, March, 1914. :- Apportioned directly on the District £1758-7-10; District proportion of Co-at-large charges in respect of Main Roads £ 1052-0-0, making a total cost to the District of £ 2791 - 7 - 10.
