The following report was read from the Rev. D. Coghlan, P. P. on the state of the Aughrim Burial-Ground:-

Kindly bring under the notice of the Ballinasloe No. 1. Rural District Council at théir Meeting on Saturday next the following statement.

On Wednesday last Mr. John Curley of Meelehan, was buried in Aughrim Cemetery. Owing to water soaking in, the grave could be only dug two feet six inches deep, and when the funeral procession arrived there was over a foot of yellowish water in the grave. I had to get a man to teem this water out; then the scraws which had been cut to cover the grave had to be put in under the coffin so as to keep it out of the water, at least while the last prayers were being said. The coffin was as usual covered with the soil removed from the grave, the "soil" in this case being a sticky mixture of water and yellow clay. This burial took place under favourable circumstances as the day was dry, the condition of a grave on a wet day, I prefer to leave to your imagination.

This is not the first time I have had to complain of the state of Aughrim Cemetery. In 1892 I made a similar complaint, I had been then only a short time in Aughrim, and was sanguine enough to think that it was only necessary for me to represent to the Council the want of facilities for proper christian burial, to have the abuses complained of removed. That was 21 years ago, and the sum total of all that was done since was the digging of a drain <u>outside</u> the Cemetery which has proved of no avail to keep the plot dry.

I now formally ask the Council to acquire at once, Compulsory or otherwise, a suitable Cemetery Plot for the parish of Aughrim. I can no longer stand idly by and assist at the interment of my good decent Catholic people in graves in which one would hesitate before interring a beast. The people are equally determined to tolerate it no longer, and if money can be found to fence roads in my Parish toprevent graziers' bullocks falling into a <u>clean boghole</u> surely it can be found the provide the Catholics of the Parish of a Cemetery which will ensure that their deepest feelings are not wounded as they have hitherto been, by the spectacle of the remains of their

As none is avai an additional reason is here forecoming, if one were requi for the provision of a new Cemetery plot in Aughrim Parish Trusting that this will be my <u>final</u> application to Council on this matter.

Letter from the Local Government Board No 8.121, dated the 18th February, 1913, stating that they have received the report of their Medical Inspector, Sir Acheson MacCullagh, relating to the sanitary condition of the District, extracts from which they enclose; and requesting that each of the matters therein referred to may receive the careful consideration of the Council, and that orders may be made where requisite.

The Board would ask the Council to be good enough to take early action for the abatement of nuisances (manure heaps etc.,) which, they observe, are again mentioned by Sir A. MacCullagh in his report. The Board especially desire to refer the Council to the observations of Sir A. MacGullagh with respect to the continued neglect of duty by Messrs Connolly and Hession, Sanitary Sub-Officers; and in connection therewith, the Board wish to call attention to the letter which they addressed to the Council on the 26th August, 1911, and to the censure which the Council then imposed on these Officers. The Board must ask the Council to consider the advisability of retaining these Officers in their present appointments, in view of the manner in which they neglect their duties.
