The Carriker reported that the fence around this Burial Ground is broken down and cattle from the adjoining fields are trespassing on it. There are few trees and other poisonous shrubs growing in the ground which are dangerous to stock. The cost of the repairs would be £2.10/-

Lawrencetown Drains

D. Fair M.O.H. Lawrencetown, reported that the open drains at the back of the houses in Lawrencetown are in an unsanitary state; and recommending that steps be taken to have them cleaned.

That notices be served on Mrs Boddy Mrs Connolly, Mrs M Loughlin, J J Connolly and Michael Callaghan to clean this drain

Sanitary Sub-Officers Beegan, Connolly and Connor furnished their monthly reports on their respective Districts which they state are in a satisfactory condition. Anything requiring attention was brought under the notice of the Medical Officer of Health. S.S.O. Connor reported that he got the drain at Lawrencetown repaired at a cost of £2. S.S.O. Beegan reported he had two houses disinfected since last meeting.

The Reports were approved of.

A letter was read from the Secretaries of the Board of National Education dated the 27th March, 1913, referring to the Council's minute of the 22nd ultimo relative to the condition of the out-offices attached to the Kilconnell National Schools, and stating that these premises are vested in Trustees who should be communicated with. However the Commissioners are in correspondence with their Inspector, and that they are taking steps to obtain a report from the Board of Works on the matter.

AUGHRIM BURIAL GROUND.

Referring to the Council's minute of the 22nd ultimo re the above matter the Clerk reported that he communicated with Mr R.R.Wade, the Owner and with Mr R.H. Johnston, the Tenant relative to the site at Kinnaveelish for the proposed new Burial Ground for the Parish of Aughrim.

Mr Wade wrote stating that he is prepared to offer a site for new Burial Ground on the Ballinasloe Road close to old 73 mile stone in the Town-land of Coololla provided the Engineer to the Council finds the ground at least six feet over water level. If this location suits the Council can have one half statute acre, and he is satisfied to leave the price to the Council. He (Mr Wade) will only stipulate that it should be well walled in. With regard to the site at Kinnaveelish he does not consider it suitable as all the drainage runs down to the Village, and it would not be well to locate a Burial Ground alongside a Labourers Cottage. If the Townland of Kinnaveelish is selected he would suggest the North-East corner, and would expect at the rate of 20 years purchase of existing rent for one half statute acre. The lands being in the possession of Mr R.H. Johnston the Council would have to settle with him for his interest in same. He (Mr Wade) will throw no difficulty in the way of the Council.

Mr R.H. Johnston wrote stating he considers most unreasonable of the Council to ask a portion of Kinnaveelish for a Grave Yard, the Council having already taken over two acres for Labourers Cottages, and there only remains about 12 acres of that piece, and considering that the Grave Yard is required exclusively for the use of the Roman Catholics in the District it would only be fair that any land required for the purpose should be supplied by some person belonging to the Religion, and as there are several owning much larger tracts of land at Aughrim than he (Mr Johnston) has, and as suitable, if not more so, he thinks the Council should apply to some of those people for what they require. It would be different if there was no suitable land to be found at Aughrim, but the Council are aware that is not so.

It was Ordered/ That the Engineer, Mr Buckley, be asked to furnish a report as to the suitability of the Site at Coololla offered by Mr Wade.

Mr Buckley, the Council's Engineer, reported that he inspected the Pumps and other works in progress and recommends that the Killoran Burial Ground requires a wall on the Chapel side; that he inspected the Aughrim Burial Ground and considers it would be well for the Council to reconsider their decision in regard to the drainage of the Ground inasmuch as such could not be done without polluting the stream running by the village which is used by the inhabitants for culinary purposes; nothing has yet been done to the Caltraleagh and Ballydonagh Pumps and the Ervilla, Ballyglass and Gorteenaveela pumps require immediate attention.

ORDERED/

That the Contractor continue the wall on the Chapel side of the Killoran Burial Ground in accordance with the terms of his Contract. That the proposed drainage of the Aughrim Burial Ground be suspended for the present. That the Contractors be called upon to proceed with the Ballydonagh and Caltraleagh pumps. That the attention of the Contractors be called to the Ballyglass and Ervilla Pumps, and that the Engineer take the depth of the Gorteenaveela pump and report if the water is surface or comes from a spring.

A letter was read from a man named Edward Murphy, tenant of a Labourers Cottage at Killurebeg stating that he became tenant of the Cottage on the 14th December, 1912, and paid a sum of £1.5.0 on the understanding that this sum wiped out the arrears due by his predecessor in occupation, and consequently he began his tenancy on that date with a clean slate, and asking the Council to cancel the balance £1.10.6.

The Clerk having explained that out of a sum of £3.18.0 due on the Cottage Murphy had paid £2.7.0, the Council under the circumstances agree to wipe out the balance of £1.10.6.

Mr Buckley, Engineer to the Council, reported that he inspected all the Cottages in the District where money has been stopped and found that the work in general is very defective, the terms of the specification not being adhered to in a great many cases, and Contractors generally have ignored the clause dealing with the cement mortar. Mr Buckley gave a detailed statement of the defects in the following Cottages :-

Nos 4, 38, 41, 63, 83, 91 and 93 in Schemes No 9. Nos 10, 11A, 15, 32, and 52A in Scheme No 10.

AUGHRIM NEW BURIAL GROUND.

Mr Buckley, the Council's Engineer, reported that, in company with Mr Whyms, D.C. he inspected the site offered by Mr Wade for new Burial Ground at Aughrim. He considers the site a very suitable one, but inasmuch as the Parish Priest seems to have objections to the site, he did not go to the expense of having excavations made until he knows what decision the Council will come to in the matter. From observations he believes the site will prove dry at a depth of ten or twelve feet.

Some members of the Council having expressed the opinion that this site would be unsuitable it was

ORDERED - That Messrs Hayden and Taylor, the Council's Solicitors, be asked to inform the Council if they have powers to acquire compulsorily a site in the Townland of Kinnaveelish.

KILLORAN BURIAL GROUND.

Mr Buckley, the Council's Engineer, reported that he made a chain survey of Killoran Burial Ground and is plotting same. He expects to be able to submit map at next meeting. He encloses Specification and Estimate for the wall on the North side of this Burial Ground, the wall being much longer than he anticipated his estimate is accordingly greater. Mr Buckley's Estimate for the additional wall being £50.3.6, it was

Mr Chairman and Gentlemen,

The amount of work done on your roads during the Quarter has on the whole been fairly satisfactory. In very few cases, however, has the full annual supply of material been spread; and where this deficiency coupled with a bare road surface has been reported, the full payments are not being certified. On the heavy main roads from Woodlawn to Ballymacward, and from Ballinasloe to Cappataggle, the failure to supply the specified quantity of material will result in these roads deteriorating in condition and becoming in the future far more difficult and expensive to maintain. Portion of the Ballymacward road is at present very bad and the footpath towards the northern end has been consistently neglected. Part of the main road from Ballinasloe to Ahascragh is still in a poor condition; although the contractors have supplied a liberal amount of material for its maintenance. These heavy-traffic main roads require continuous surface work during the entire year and the more general use of the pick for levelling and the brush for cross-sweeping will in future be insisted on. Part of the main road from Millagh to Glontuskert is also being neglected. The other main roads in the District have been fairly attended to during the Quarter.

The District roads, with the exception of about ten contracts, are in good order. Some parapets and boundary walls will require attention during the Summer; contractors will get notices in cases where such repairs are required.

Ordered - That the consideration of the laying out of this Burial Ground, and the prices to be charged for Burial plots be placed on the Agenda for next Meeting of the Council.

Sanitary Sub-Officers Beegan and Connor reported that since last meeting their Districts are in a sanitary condition and free from infectious disease. Anything requiring attention was brought under the notice of the Medical Officer of Health.

Mr Connor reported that the pump at Lawrencetown is in an unsanitary state owing to people watering their Cattle &c at the pump, and the flag requires to be cemented.

Ordered - That a gate be got for the pump and that the Sanitary Sub-Officer be and is hereby authorised to prosecute people found watering cattle or horses at the pump.

Mr Buckley, the Council's Engineer, reported that he inspected the District since last meeting and finds that the works in connection with the completion of the Labourers Cottages are generally at a stand still, and Contractors seem to be making no efforts to complete their contracts. He notified the Contractors as to date of his inspection, and requested them to meet him, but only in a few cases did they turn up. He (Mr Buckley) should feel obliged if the Council could see their way to grant him some allowance for travelling expenses, as he finds the cost of carrying on the work more than outweighs the remuneration, and this is chiefly due to the dilatory nature of the Contractors. As a result of his last two inspections he is only able to give certificates to the amount of £32.10.0, notwithstanding that he had to pay train fare, Board and lodging, and travel over the whole Rural District twice.

The Council agreed to allow Mr Buckley travelling charges subject to the approval of the Local Government Board.

LAKEFIELD PLOT No 8.

Mr Buckley reported that it is now some time since he lock-spitted the Labourer's plot at Lakefield, and steps should be taken to have a new fence erected.

The Council took no action on this report.

The Council unanimously acceded to the application of the rent Collector, Mr Daniel Connolly, for some remuneration for going around the District by the directions of the Council's Solicitors demanding possession of Cottages and Plots which entailed six days work, and allowed him £2. (Two Pounds) subject to the approval of the Local Government Board.
