St Catherine's,
Aughrim, 13th June, 1913.

Dear Mr Gill,

In reply to Mr Johnston, a copy of whose letter you kindly forwarded to me, it is sufficient to say that my only reason for not selecting a site for the proposed cemetery on land belonging to a Catholic Landlord is that there is not a single Catholic Landlord in my Parish of Aughrim, nor has there been one since the Battle of Aughrim 1691. I had therefore no object in selecting a site on Mr Johnston's land in particular except that I wanted to get a site conveniently situated and easily accessible to the Public. The site at Kinnaveelish fulfils both these requirements and I would impress on your Council the necessity for providing this Parish of Aughrim with a suitable Cemetery at least an Irish acre in area without delay.

Mr Whyms proposed and Mr Flaherty seconded that a site at Kinnaveelish be acquired compulsorily for a Burial Ground.

After some discussion it was finally agreed to advertise for applications from persons who are willing to sell a plot of land suitable for a Burial Ground within a convenient distance of Aughrim.

MOHER PUMP.

Dr Ressiter, M. O. H. wrote recommending that a sample of water from this pump be sent for analysis.

ORDERED - That Dr Rossiter's recommendation be complied with.

Dr Ressiter, M.O. H. Ballinaslee Dispensary District, reported that the floor of the kitchen and two rooms in the house occupied by John Quirke of Moher require to be concreted.

KILLORAN NEW BURIAL GROUND.

Mr Buckley, the Council's Engineer, reported that the work at Killoran Burial Ground is being carried out very satisfactorily, and he anticipates that the enclosure walls will be finished before next meeting of the Council. He would like to call attention to the fence alongside the road which consists of a ditch about eight feet wide upon which it is propossed to erect a wire pailing, with an ordinary iron gate as entrance. Should the Council decide to have the walks through the grave yard, as per drawings already submitted, the road fence and entrance will certainly be out of keeping with the Burial Ground as a whole. It would be well if the Council appointed a Committee to inspect the Burial Ground, who would report as to the advisability or otherwise of having the ditch alongside the road removed, and a wall with suitable entrance gate at centre erected.

ORDERED - That the ditch alongside the road be removed and a Wall substituted and that advertisement be issued for Contractors for the work, also for laying out the walks through the ground.

It was, after some discussion, agreed that when the walks in the Burial Ground are laid out that a Committee be appointed to inspect the place and arrange the prices to be charged for Grave plots.

LAWRENCETOWN BURIAL GROUND.

Sanitary Sub-Officer Connor reported that the weeds &c in this Burial Ground require to be out and removed.

ORDERED - To be done, cost not to exceed 5/-.

CLONTOUSKERT BURIAL GROUND.

It was ORDERED - That the Caretaker of this Burial Ground be called upon to remove the weeds &c, and he informed that unless he is more careful in regard to keeping the Ground in order that the Council will dispense with his services.

The Council, pursuant to advertisement, had before them only one tender for building a wall in front of this Burial Ground and erecting an entrance Gate &c; and for making and laying out walks through the Ground, namely, from Owen Kerans the present Contractor for portion of the Work, at the following Rates.

For Wall, providing and erecting entrance gate.....£75.0.0.

For Laying out the Grounds &c.....£49.0.0.

The Council unanimously accepted Mr Kerans' tenders.

RESOLVED -

That the Local Government Board be asked to be so good as to sanction a Loan of £235. for the purpose of providing this Burial Ground.

AUGHRIM NEW BURIAL GROUND.

Letter from Mr R.R. Wade, Carrowmore, Aughrim, dated the 25th July, 1913, offering, in reply to the Council's advertisement, one half statute acre of land in the Townland of Coolola about 400 yards from the Village of Aughrim, on the Ballinasloe Road, for the purposes of a Burial Ground.

The Council considered the site unsuitable, and on the motion of Mr John Whyms, seconded by Mr M. Geraghty it was unanimously

RESOLVED - That the Council's Solicitors, Messrs Hayden & Taylor, be, and are hereby, authorised to take all necessary steps for the acquisition of one Irish acre of land for the purposes of a Burial Ground in the Townland of Kinnaveelish in the occupation of Mr R.H. Johnson for the use of the Parish of Aughrim.

It was agreed upon that the Clerk fist write to Mr Johnson and ask if he would consent to the Council taking the land by Agreement, and if not that the Clerk instruct the Solicitors to proceed in the matter.

Dr. Egan, M. . H. Killaan Dispensary District, reported that Edward Gannon's yard at Kilconnell is in a very unsanitary state owing, he believes, to a sewer leading from it being blocked, and recommending that this sewer be opened to carry away the water.

ORDERED - That notices be served on the persons interested to clean this sewer.

Dr. Egan also reported that the house occupied by Patrick Murphy of Garrymore requires to be limewashed and thatched.

ORDERED - That the usual notice be served in this case.

S.S.O. Hession reported that his District is in a sanitary state and free from any infectious disease. There is one bad house in the District to which he called the Medical Officer's attention.

S.S.O. Connor reported that his District is in a sanitary state and free from sickness; the drain leading from the Pump at Lawencetown requires to be cleaned; that the rabbits are roofing the graves in the Abbey Burial Ground at Clontouskert.

ORDERED - That the question of cleaning the drain from the pump at Lawrencetown be referred to the local Councillors, and that advertisement be issued for parties to destroy the rabbits at the Abbey Burial Ground.

was temporarily engaged with the Board's approval. There was no Engineer to certify for payment as the work was done long before Mr Dunne' employment, and the £5.10.0 remians unpaid. The fence is not yet removed back and the Owner is threatening further proceedings. Kelly will not remove the fence until he gets a guarantee for payment for doing so, in addition to allowing him the £5.10.0 already due. For the two years this is going on Kelly paid no rent and the Council are desirous of compromising the matter by allowing the £5.10.0 to go against the rent for which they ask the approval of the L.G.B.)

Mr Buckley, the Council's Engineer, reported that owing to a bad cold for some days he could not make a general inspection of the works in progress during the month. He will make a general inspection in about a fortnight.

Mr Connolly, rent collector, reported that Martin Dolan has left his Cottage at Crowsnest and did not give up the key and leaving £2.2.6 rent due. Michael Kelly of Carrownea owes £3.18.0 which he states he is not able to pay. Kelly is over 80 years of age and he (Mr Connolly) would ask the Council to give the matter their attention. Mr Connolly also reported that John Kelly of Lakefield owes £8.9.0 which he states he will not pay as the Council owe him £5.10.0 for fencing the additional portion of land given him.

ORDERED - That Mr Connolly dispose of the crop growing on Dolan's plot at Crowsnest; that Michael Kelly's sureties be written to.

A letter was read from the labourer, John Kelly, above referred to, stating that he had an application from the Council's Solicitors for payment of the rent due by him; pointing out that the Council owe him £5.10.0 for making the fence around the additional portion of land which the Council agreed to pay him. He will not pay any rent until the Council allows him the £5.10.0, nor will he make the new fence ordered at the June meeting until he is sure that the Council will treat him better. The cost of the new fence will be the same money (£5.10.0), and stating that if is allowed the amount for the fence in the first case against the rent he owes and if he is paid fx for the new fence he will make it whenever he is ordered.

ORDERED - That Kelly be paid for the work ordered to be done by the Council subject to the approval of the L.G.B

(The Clerk desires to explain for the information of the L.G.B. the circumstances of this case. When the Council were providing Kelly with a cottage and an acre of land, the area of the plot including the fencing and building was supposed to be one acre and ten perches/for which the Owner was paid, but some years after the labourer (Kelly) at got the plot surveyed when it was found to be some 18 or 20 perches short. The Council then took the additional land which was marked out by their then Engineer (Mr Hardiman). Kelly went outside Mr Hardimans marks taking extra land and fenced it for which he claims £5.10.0. The Owner took proceedings against the Council to have the fence moved back. In the meantime Mr Hardiman left the Council's employment and Mr Dunne

AUGHRIM NEW BURIAL GROUND.

Messrs Hayden & Taylor, the Council's Solicitors, wrote under date the 28th August, 1913, that in accordance with the Council's instructions they wrote to Mr R.H. Johnstone that it was the intention of the Council to acquire by compulsion part of the lands of Kinnaveelish for the purpose of a Burial Ground; and enclosing a copy of his reply for the information of the Council. The papers are before Counsel to draw the necessary petition to the L.G. Board, and requesting to be supplied with a map of the proposed site showing the nearest houses and their distance away from the plot.

Mr Johnstone's reply was as follows :-

Bawnboy, 21st August, 1913,

" Dear Sirs.

I am in receipt of your letter of the 18th inst

- " and in reply beg to say that I consider it most unreasonable for
- " the District Council to ask for a piece of the Kinnaveelish land
- " for a Burial Ground. I understand they have been offered a plot
- " of ground by Mr Wade but I suppose no land will suit them except
- " Kinnaveelish. There is plenty of land round Aughrim in the hands
- " of Roman Catholics more suitable for the purpose than the
- " Kinnaveelish land and I think a plot should be taken from some of
- " them. This unreasonable application will certainly be opposed.

Mr Hayden further reported that in company with the Clerk and the Rev D. Coghlan he inspected the site originally selected by the Committee which is on the North-West Side of the plot at Kinnaveelish, and stated that the Rev Pr. Coghlan wishes the site to be changed to the Southern side. After some discussion Mr Flaherty proposed and Mr Commolly seconded

Mr Dowling moved as an amendment and Mr Carty seconded

The Form was signed by the Chairman presiding and ORDERED - To be forward to the L.G. Board with the necessary documents.

Dr Fair, M. O. H. Lawrencetown Dispensary District, reported the occurrence of a case of Scarlet Fver which had been removed to Hospital, and the house and clothing disinfected.

MOHER WATER SUPPLY.

The Clerk reported that in compliance with the Council's instructions he sent a sample of water from the pump at Moher for analysis, and that Sir Charles Cameron had reported that the water was of a light yellow colour, a moderate number of microorganisms present. The water is an inferior one but not so inferior as to be unfit for use.

LAWRENCETOWN PUMP.

Dr Fair, M. O. H. Lawrencetown Dispensary District, reported that the drain leading from the pump at Lawrencetown is choked up and lest the water should be contaminated again he recommends that the drain be thoroughly cleaned to its full extent.

Ordered - That the Engineer prepare a specification for this work, and that advertisement be issued for Contractors to carry it out. Tenders to be considered at the next meeting of the Council.

Letter from the L.G.Board No L.8,659/12 dated the 29th August,1913, referring to the minute of the 26th ultimo relative to the claim of a labourer named John Kelly for payment of a sum of £5.10.0.for erecting a fence on the plot of land which he holds from the Council under the Labourers Acts, and stating that it would appear to the Board that Kelly made the fence, for which he is now claiming remuneration, in the wrong place, and that further expense will be incurred in taking it down and re-erecting it. Under these circumstances the Board see no reason to consent to the payment of any remuneration to Kelly unless he takes down the fence and re-builds it in the proper place when the Board would be prepared to give their sanction to the payment of the amount claimed (£5.10.0); and adding that the Council should now proceed against him for recovery of the rent due by him.

MELVIN w THE COUNCIL - Kelly's Plot at Lakefield.

Messrs Hayden & Taylor wrote informing the Council that they have accepted a writ of summons against the Council on the 25th instant in this case. It appears that the Labourer (John Kelly) knocked the wrong fence. Mr Buckley, the Council's Engineer, informed them that he lockspitted for a new fence and directed the Labourer which fence to knock in the presence of Mr Melvin who agreed to the marking. Apparently nothing has since been done hence the present proceedings.

Mr Hayden, who was present, was directed to defend the proceedings and with that view read a draft copy of a letter which he proposes sending to Mr Melvin's Solicitor, of which the Council approved, and ORDERED- That proceedings be taken against Kelly for the rent due by him.

AUGHRIM NEW BURIAL GROUND.

Letter from the L.G. Board No 46,992 dated the 10th September 1913, referring to the entry in the Minutes of the 30th ultimo relative to the proposal to acquire certain lands for the purpose of providing a new burial ground at Aughrim; and pointing out that if the Council will require compulsory powers by means of a Provision—al Order, to be presented to Parliamnet for confirmation next Session, notices must be published under Section 203 (2) of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, before the end of November; and enclosing a copy of the Board's Memorandum of Instructions as to Provisional Orders under the Public Health Acts.

ORDERED - That the attention of the Council's Solicitors be drawn to this letter.

Letter from Mr Buckley, the Council's Engineer, dated the 9th September, 1913, enclosing site Map for the proposed new Burial Ground at Aughrim. The site finally selected is coloured "Red" and contains one acre Irish, or one acre two roods and nineteen perches Statute. The Labourers plots are marked on the site Map, and the distance from Burial Ground to nearest plot is 165 yards.

Dr Rossiter, Medical Officer of Health Ballinasloe Dispensary
District reported that he inspected the Aughrim Burial Ground on the
17th September, 1913, it is very congested, there does not appear to be
any available space for new graves. As several families have recently migrated into the Parish it becomes necessary to provide a Burial
Ground suitable for the requirements of the Parish. He also inspected

the selected site for the new Burial Ground, and in his opinion it is very suitable.

The Rev D. Coghlan wrote under date 26th September, 1913, stating that as Parish Priest of Aughrim he begs to bring under the notice of the Council the absolute and urgent necessity of providing a new Burial Ground for that District on the following grounds:-

- 1 There are no grave spaces in the olf burial ground.
- 2 It is liable to floods and cannot be drained.
- 3 There are at present 143 families in the Parish and at present 70 of these have no graveyard accommodation anywhere.
- 4 There are amogst them a large number of migrants recently come to the Parish, and 30 more families (on the as yet undivided Handy, Wade, Johnstone and Clonbrock Estates) will also require grave-yard accommodation.
- 5 In the present graveyard it is impossible to make graves deeper than two feet as it would be filled with water before the coffin can be placed in it, and on more than one occasion he (Fr Coghlan) has seen the people take water and puddle out of the grave before putting the coffin in. This state of things is most dangerous to the health of the community, particularly as the grave yard is practically situated in the Village of Aughrim and there are many families living quite close to it. The Schoolhouse is only separated from the graveyard by a wall.
- 6 Time after time old graves have to be re-opened to receive new burials and the bones of the dead are scattered amongst clay and stones. This is of course most disrespectful to the remains of the dead and should not be tolerated under any circumstances.
- 7 Again he (Fr Coghlan) wishes to point out that it is in his opinion and in the opinion of the residents absolutely imperative to provide new burial accommodation for the Parish of Aughrim both for the protection of the public health and the maintenance of public decency.

The Chairman (Mr Heban) proposed and Mr John Whyms seconded and unanimously

RESOLVED - That we, the Ballinasloe No 1 Rural District Council
as Sanitary Authority and acting as a Burial Board
having had before us the report of our Medical Officer
of Health, Dr Rossiter, and letters from the Parish

Priest, the Rev Daniel Coghlan, and it appearing that for the protection of the Public Health and the maintenance of public decency and to prevent a violation of the KREKEN respect due to the remains of the dead the burials in Aughrim graveyard should be wholly or partly discontinued the Council request the Local Government Board to hold an Inquiry at the earliest possible date as to the condition of said Burial Ground and the necessity of closing same subject to such conditions as the Local Government Board may impose and subject also to the rights of those who are entitled to burial accommodation

LAWRENCETOWN SEWERS.

The Council, pursuant to advertisement, had before them only one Tender for cleaning the sewers at Lawrence town in accordance with the Engineer's specification, namely, from Patrick White who undertook to do the work for £8.7.6 which was accepted by the Council.

The several Sanitary Sub-Officers reported that their respective Districts are in a sanitary condition and free from infectious sickness. Anything requiring attention has been brought of under the notice/the Medical Officers of Health.

Arising out of Mr Connor's report it was

ORDERED-That the Caretaker of the Clontouskert Abbey Burial Ground
be called upon to put the wall, gate and walks in proper
repair and cut the weeds.

Arising out of a report made by Dr Egan, Medical Officer of Health Killaan Dispensary District, that the yard at the rere of Mr E.

Gannen's house in Kilcennel is in an unsanitary condition being flooded &c owing to having no outlet.

Mr Gannen came before the Council and stated that the sewer was blocked in the premises of a Mr Callanan who would not open same and asking the Council to enter on Mr Callanan's lands for the purpose of opening the sewer for his (Mr Gannen's) accommodation. This the Council declined to do, but directed the Clerk to get their Solicitors' opinion on the matter.

Mr Buckley, the Council's Engineer, reported that he inspected the Pumps at Caltraleagh and Ballydonagh - in the former the excavation is full of water, stays inserted and flags on the ground, in the latter there is some water in the well and slight spring, but not nearly enough and requires to be sunk deeper

ORDERED --- That the Contractors' attention be called to this report.

KILLORAN NEW BURIAL GROUND.

Mr Buckley reported that he inspected this Burial Ground, the ditch alongside the road is now removed and some levelling done. Not progress made since the last inspection.

The Council V James Murray of Corballymore.

Messrs Hayden & Taylor, the Council's Solicitors, wrote under date the 12th September, 1913, stating that at the Lawrencetown Petty Sessions on the 11th instant they got an order for possession of the Cottage in this case.

Mr Buckley, the Council's Engineer, reported that with reference to the Lakefield plot he could not get any Contractor to make the new fence. However, he saw the tenant's wife and she informed him that her husband would erect the fence as soon as the weather would become soft. In his last report he recommended that a new chimney-breast be erected in the Cottage accupied by Callighy in the Townland of Killevney, and asking the Council's instructions in the matter. He also reported that the floors in Cottage No 38 Kinnaveelish, Aughrim, would require to be taken up and relaid. He visited this Cottage again on the 19th September, 1913, and had the flooring boards raised. The joists which are only 3" x 2" instead of 42" x 2" are laid directly on the vegetable soil. There is no air space and he has no doubt the floors will be useless in a very short time. The roof is also leaking. He pointed out all defects to the Contractor's representative, and he is not prepared to give a further certificate on this Cottage until the defects have been made good.

Mr Buckley subsequently submitted a letter from the tenant stating that he had the fence of his plot at Lakefield finished.

Letter from the L.G.Board No L.9834 dated the 26th September, 1913, referring to previous correspondence respecting the proposal of the Council to pay Mr Connolly, Collector of Rents of Labourers Cottages a sum of £2.in respect of his services in serving notices to quit and demanding possession of cottages and plots from tenants thereof under the Labourers Acts; and stating that the Council should be guided by their Legal Adviser as to the legality of paying extra remuneration to the Collector for the services mentioned, having regard to the terms and conditions arranged with the Collector at the time of his appointment.

Mr Hayden, the Council's Selicitor, who was present stated that if Mr Connolly did not serve the notices &c some one else should do the work and get paid, and he thought it fair that Mr Connolly should be paid, moreover he understood that the L.G.B. sanctioned payment for similar work last year. In the circumstances the Council asks the Board's sanction.

(Letter No L.5326 dated the 20th May, 1912).

The Collector, Mr Connolly, reported that the Millareeny Cottage, which is vacant for some time, is greatly damaged all the windows are broken as also are those of the Clonigney Cottage which is let to a man named John Clarke but who does not live in it.

Mr Connolly further reported that most of the Labourers are refusing to pay rent owing to their Cottages not being repaired; that a Labourer named Michael Kelly of Carrownea owes £1.17.8, which he says he is unable to pay.

The Clerk stated that whenever the labourers complained of the repair of their Cottages he immediately called on the Contractor to at once carry out the repairs. The case of Michael Kelly was referred to the Solicitors.

The Clerk laid before the Council an account sent in by Mr Joseph. L. Dunne, late acting Engineer amounting to £26.19.8 for professional services rendered by him under the Labourers Acts betwen the 8th November, 1912 and the 31st March, 1913.

The Clerk stated that he was afraid that the account was barred by section 51 (7) of the Local Government (Ireland) Act,1898, and suggested that the Council ask the permission of the L.G. Board to pay the amount when it was RESOLVED/

That the L.G. Board be asked to be so good as to issue their sanction to the payment of Mr Dunne's account

The applications of several tenants of Labourers Cottages to have their Cottages repaired were referred to the respective Contractors for keeping the Cottages in repair.

Mr Hoban handed in the following Notice of Motion :-
