

BALLINASLOE RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

FO

QUARTERLY MEETING TO BE HELD 17th OCTOBER 1914.

Mr Chairman and Gentleman.

I herewith present for your consideration my recommendations on Form 22 for the quarter ending 30th September 1914. You will observe that on this occasion I have not resorted to the expedient of striking off' but at the same time I have been compelled to defer a very considerable sum.

The road contractors in your district are amongst the most backward, in the matter of material, in the whole Fast Riding. You will remember that at your last quarterly meeting I issued a warning that no money would be paid unless the full specified material was given In hardly a single instance has this been observed and hence I am holding over this quarter's money. If full material has not been supplied, and fair work done on road repair, before January 1st 1915 I am prepared to spend defaulting contractor's money on their respective roads and in addition shall take proceedings at Quarter Sessions.

Next to the supply of material, perhaps the most important part of road repair is patching. Small loose and badly placed sheets will not in future be tolerated. All sheets must be long, compact and skilfully placed so as to divert traffic. Another very important consideration is efficient drainage which can only be attained by thorough edging, and widening, with sufficient and adequate outlets. Hedges and overhanging branches, where prejudicial, must be cut and owners must be compelled to have this work carried out in accordance with the notice.

Speaking generally, I regret that I am unable to give you a favourable report on the work maintained by contract for the past quarter

The efforts, except in a few cases, to make provision for the heavier operations demanded during the Winter Season, are non-existent, and the prevailing policy appears to be one of drift.

At one period I had hopes that our road contractors had arrived at a proper sense of their responsibilities, but if such was ever their state, it seems to be vanishing as fast as the departing swallows.

Were it not for the conditions at present prevailing I had intended placing before you a proposal to Steam-roll the more important main roads in your district comprised by the following:-

- (a) Part of the road from Ballinasloe to Mountbellew, from U.B. Ballinasloe to D.B. at Southpark.
- (b) Part of the road from Ballinasloe to Loughrea from U.B. to D.B. at Ballintubber.
- (c) Part of the road from Ballinasloe to Portumna from U.B. to D.B. at Feabeg.

I now mention the matter so that you may give it a preliminary consideration. There is little question that if we in this County are to advance, and if our roads are to compare with those of neighbouring Counties, we must steam-roll on a large scale. The cost may be greater in the first instance, but when the great advantages of improved traction, and longer life with a much diminished maintenance are taken into account, any such added expenditure incurred will be more than recomped. What has been done in other counties can be as well done in Galway and I misunderstand the Ballinasloe District Council if they fail to give t the necessary lead.

The loan to Steam-roll the road from Woodlawn to Alloon D.B.

has been sanctioned and I now have the work well in hand. The

loan for the Esker New Road has also been sanctioned and before

many months have expired I shall be in a position to report a

satisfactory

satisfactory completion of this long delayed work.

The proposals before you in my name are necessary and require attention in the near future.

CLONFERT NEW ROAD.

A Petition was received from a number of people living in Clonfert Callows asking the Council to spend the available sum of £450 now available on one mile of the Clonfert Road, a letter from Dr. Fair was also read in favour of this petition, and a further petition was read from other Ratepayers in favour of expending the moneyon part of the road not yet made. A Committee appointed by the Council on the 16th. August, 1914 recommended that a sum of £180 be expended on the 92 perches on which

nothing has yet been done, and then the remaining sum of £300 be expended on the whole 612 perches of the whole road, when after a lengthy discussion, the Council with Mr. McDermott dissenting adopte the report of the Committee.

A letter was read from the Rev. D. Coghlan, Aughrim Ballinasloe dated the 16th. October, 1914 pointing out to the Council a dangerous corner between the Aughrim Police Barrack and the National Schools was left in the hands of the County Surveyor.

Letter from the Local Government Board No. 149/M/. dated 2nd. October, 1914 forwarding Returns to be filled up showing the Amounts which have been paid as salaries to the Sanitary Officers of the Rural District for the year ended the 30th. ultimo with a view to recoupment being made in respect thereof.

The Committee, appointed on the 31st ultimo, reported that they inspected the Village of Clonigney and found that the people have a long way to go to get water, and even then the water is of a very inferior class. A pump in the Village is very much required and they recommend a site on the lands of Mr D. Hession in that Townland.

THE ADVERTISEMENT BE ISSUED FOR CONTRACTORS FOR ERECTING A PUMP, TENDERS TO BE CONSIDERED ON THE 19th. DECEMBER, 1914.

Mr Dunne, acting Engineer in room of Mr Buckley (resigned) reported that the Contractor for cleaning and repairing the Kilconnell sewers has made fair progress with the work, almost the whole of the open sewers have been cleaned, deepened and widened. The work yet to be done includes cleaning and extending closed sewers. This work includes cleaning three County road gullets, and this appears more properly to belong to the County road Authorities.
