The Dairy Inspector Mr. Egan reported that he had been pressing the necessity on some of the Cowkeepers of making some alterations and improvements in their premises in most cases satisfaction has been given. In one place nothing has been done but the owner is doing up a separate house and when finished intends removing his ^{Cows} ~~Cows~~ to it. In the case of Martin Fahey of Kildclooney none of his instructions have been attended to, and he has repeatedly put off the construction of a channel for drainage and has not provided a window or opening for admission of light in his cowshed. The various premises are fairly well attended to, and the cows are free from disease.

ORDERED/- THAT FAHEY BE WRITTEN TO TO HAVE THESE IMPROVEMENTS MADE IMMEDIATELY.

Sergeant Griffin of Kildonnell reported that John Pender of Kildonnell has one bovine animal in his possession which appears to be suffering from tuberculosis with emaciation.

The Acting Clerk reported that he had not heard from the Clerk of the Limerick Union who was written to on the 30th. ultimo asking him if the Sureties of the Artesian Well Boring Co. Limerick were solvent, when it was ORDERED/- THAT THE ARTESIAN WELL BORING COMPANY BE WRITTEN TO AND ASK THEM IF THEY WILL GIVE A GARRANTEE SOCIETY FOR THEIR SURETIES.

REPORT TO
BALLINASLOE RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL FOR MEETING
TO BE HELD ON 23rd JANUARY 1915.

Mr. Chairman, Ladies, & Gentlemen.

A very fair effort has been made by the contractors in your District to maintain the roads according to specification and my directions. The supply of material, though not sufficient, was a decided improvement on that for the corresponding period of last year, and an advance is also noticeable in the methods of applying it. My instructions respecting the cutting of prejudicial hedges and branches have for the most part been observed which is a subject of gratification especially when the baneful effects of high close hedges both to a road and all road users, are considered.

I have to report the satisfactory completion of the Esher New Road. There still remains about 40 perches to carry the roadway up to the Canal. This I have not done partly for the reason that

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that I consider it unnecessary and think that the money still available could be more advantageously employed in fencing and draining that part now made. I would be glad of a direction from your Board on the matter.

The work of preparation for steamrolling the Woodlawn Road is proceeding as satisfactorily as weather conditions permit.
