Mr Chairman, Ladies, and Gentleman,

In submitting my recommendations for payment on Form 22, for the Quarter ending 31st March 1915. I beg to call attention to the growing practice amongst the Contractors in your district of tendering only for the fancy, easily maintained roads, and leaving those which have been allowed to deteriorate for years in my hands.

I beg to state here publically that on no account will I tolerate this state of affairs longer. Either every road must have its contractor, of I shall be compelled to introduce a. District Direct Labour Scheme for the whole district; and in future, roads which are not contracted for I must have referred back until such time as contractors are forthcoming.

As to the work done during the quarter, I have as usual to complain of the shortnge of material in most instances and the method of application in many; but I have still a greater cause of complaint, in that a large number of contractors deferred the spreading of their material till the last month of the quarter with the result that sheets of stones which by now should be thoroughly incorporated with the old road surface, are scattered all over the road and will have to be raked off again. In future, contractors who have not spread half their material before the lst December shall be considered defaulters, and shall be dealt with accordingly. All loose stones should be now raked off.

I would impress on contractors the necessity of getting thewrough material out early this summer, and I shall make every

KILLORAN NEW BURIAL GROUND.

The Committee appointed to inspect the Killeran New Burial-Ground made the following report to the Council:-"Ladies & Gentlemen,

"As requested by you we visited the Killeran "new Cemetery on Sunday last for the purpose of laying out the "grave spaces and ascertaining what scale of fees it would be "necessary to charge in order to cover the cost the Council has "incurred in procuring the Cemetery.

We were met by the Rev. Fathers Ryan & O'Donchee,

and

"and by a large number of the Parishoners.

We first proceeded to apportion two plots - one to non-"Catholics - and another to provide free spaces to persons unable "to pay. We learned there is only @MM#M@M one non-Catholic resident "in the Parish and he has a burial-plot in a neighbouring parish, we "considered a small portion of the Cometery would suffice to "accommodate non-Gatholics likely to be buried there. We realized "of course that any portion of this plot not eventually utilized "would mean a less of revenue to the Council. We therefore left "a space 54 feet by 18 feet for this purpose.

"We were next informed by the Reverened Clergymen that there "were not above eight families in the Parish who would be unable to "pay for grave spaces. We therefore left a second space of 36 feet "by 18 feet to provide free plots for such people.

" This would leave about 462 bods or (allowing three bods to "(each plot) 154 plots available for allotment by the Council.

"It was represented to us that these already enjoying burial "rights in the old Cemetery would be entitled to preferential terms "of payment and we therefore consider of one pound a plot were "charged to such persons, and Two pounds ten shillings a plot to "all others this scale of fees would about cover the Cauncil's "liabilities.

"We think it would be very necessary for the Council to "procure through the Relieving Officer or otherwise a reliable list "of those persons having burial-rights in the old Cemetery as a "guide when selling new plots.

"Within the last two years Sir Edward Carson openly boasted in press and platform his intention to defy English law, and even expressed his preference for German Rule rather than that of England as established in Ireland under Home Rule.

"We cannot, therefore, look on his inclusion in the new Cabinet as anything else than a gross preference shown towards Sir Edward and his followers in Ulster, and a direct inducement to them to oppose the introduction of Home Rule when the opportune time comes."
