Messrs Michael Geraghty, Thomas Glynn, & M. Garty reported that in accordance with the Council's Order they inspected the flooding complained of at Martin Goode's cottage at Lowville, and recommending that a drain 160 yards long be opened for the purpose of carrying away the overflow in rainy weather cost not to exceed £2.

Read a letter from the Artesian Well Boring Company, Belvulle, Kilmeedy Co. Limerick dated the 3rd. March, 1915 naming the Gresham Fire and Accident Insurance Co. London as their Sureties for sinking well at Cappagh and Gorteenaveela, the Council accepted the company named, and ORDERED/- THAT THE ARTESIAN WELL BORING COMPANY PROCEED WITH THE WORK IMMEDIATELY.

The Committee appointed by the Council to inspect the Kiltormer Burial Ground recommended the work to be carried out by the Caretaker John Hibbett at a cost of £2. 10. 0. (Two pounds ten shillings).

Dr. Fair, Medical Officer of Health Lawrencetown Dispensary District reported a case of enteric fever from Clonfert Eyrecourt and that the necessary precautions were taken to prevent the spread of the Disease.

Dr. Rossitor, Medical Officer of Health reported that the house occupied by William Glynn of Northbrook requires to be thatched and limewashed.

ORDERED/- THAT USUAL NOTICE BE SERVED.

Dr. Egan, Medical Officer Killaan Dispensary District reported that the house occupied by John Ward of Barnavilla is in a very insanitary condition owing to water raising in the floor and which makes it unfit for habitation, and recommending that the Congested Districts Board might be approached to purchase with a view to provide sanitary dwellings for the people of this little village.

Dr. Egan further reported that the house occupied by Michael Ward, and Patrick Kilroy were in a similar condition to that one occupied by John Ward and recommending that the same course be taken.

ORDERED/- THAT THE CONGESTED DISTRICTS BOARD BE WRITTEN TO ON THE MATTER.

AUGHRIM BURIAL GROUND.

Mr. Dunne, the Council's Acting Engineer reported that he inspected the alternative site on the old road adjoining the Labourers Plot and considers that it would be a suitable site for proposed Burial-Ground, some filling and levelling would require to be done.

ORDERED/-
That the County Surveyor be written to to have the Sewer in Kilconnell cleaned as same is not included in the Contractor's tender it being County Work.

Letter from the Local Government Board No. L 2093 : 1915 dated the 12th. March, 1915 referring to the Council's Minutes of the 27th. ultimo relative to the remuneration to be allowed to Mr. Dunne for his services as temporary Engineer under the Labourers Acts and requesting that they may be furnished with full particulars respecting the Council's proposal, including a statement of the actual work required to be done by the Engineer to complete the Schemes at present in operation, and whether the proposal applies to work done by Mr. Dunne since his temporary appointment, and if so, what is the extra payment proposed to be made to him in respect of such work.

THE COUNCIL PROPOSE TO ALLOW Mr. DUNNE TRAVELLING EXPENSES AT THE RATE OF SIX PENCE PER MILE FOR ALL WORKS. IN THE CASE OF THE LABOURERS COTTAGES AT PRESENT IN PROGRESS (nine) THEY ARE SO SCATTERED AND THE AMOUNTS TO BE CERTIFIED ARE SO SMALL, THAT THE COUNCIL CONSIDER IT WOULD BE UNREASONABLE NOT TO ALLOW EXPENSES.

IN THE CASE OF ALL OTHER WORKS, INCLUDING COTTAGE MAINTENANCE CONTRACTS, WELLS, &c., IT IS PROPOSED THAT NO OBJECTION IS RAISED TO ALLOW TRAVELLING EXPENSES.

BLACKSTICK'S PLOT.

Mr. Dunne the Council's temporary Engineer reported that he had measured the above plot and found same to be 28 perches short of one acre and 23 perches, the sod fences are taken into account also gripes but not road fence.

REPORT TO THE
BALLINASLOE RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL FOR
THE QUARTER ENDING 31st MARCH 1915.

Mr Chairman, Ladies, and Gentlemen,

In submitting my recommendations for payment on Form 22, for the Quarter ending 31st March 1915, I beg to call attention to the growing practice amongst the Contractors in your district of tendering only for the fancy, easily maintained roads, and leaving those which have been allowed to deteriorate for years in my hands.

I beg to state here publically that on no account will I tolerate this state of affairs longer. Either every road must have its contractor, or I shall be compelled to introduce a ~~District~~ Direct Labour Scheme for the whole district; and in future, roads which are not contracted for I must have referred back until such time as contractors are forthcoming.

As to the work done during the quarter, I have as usual to complain of the shortage of material in most instances and the method of application in many; but I have still a greater cause of complaint, in that a large number of contractors deferred the spreading of their material till the last month of the quarter, with the result that sheets of stones which by now should be thoroughly incorporated with the old road surface, are scattered all over the road and will have to be raked off again. In future, contractors who have not spread half their material before the 1st December shall be considered defaulters, and shall be dealt with accordingly. All loose stones should be now raked off.

I would impress on contractors the necessity of getting their rough material out early this summer, and I shall make every effort

"and by a large number of the Parishoners.

" We first proceeded to apportion two plots - one to non-Catholics - and another to provide free spaces to persons unable to pay. We learned there is only ~~xxxxxx~~ one non-Catholic resident in the Parish and he has a burial-plot in a neighbouring parish, we considered a small portion of the Cemetery would suffice to accommodate non-Catholics likely to be buried there. We realized of course that any portion of this plot not eventually utilized would mean a loss of revenue to the Council. We therefore left a space 54 feet by 18 feet for this purpose.

" We were next informed by the Reverend Clergymen that there were not above eight families in the Parish who would be unable to pay for grave spaces. We therefore left a second space of 36 feet by 18 feet to provide free plots for such people.

" This would leave about 462 beds or (allowing three beds to (each plot) 154 plots available for allotment by the Council.

" It was represented to us that those already enjoying burial rights in the old Cemetery would be entitled to preferential terms of payment and we therefore consider of one pound a plot were charged to such persons, and Two pounds ten shillings a plot to all others this scale of fees would about cover the Council's liabilities.

" We think it would be very necessary for the Council to procure through the Relieving Officer or otherwise a reliable list of those persons having burial-rights in the old Cemetery as a guide when selling new plots.
