Letter from the Local Government Board No. 31,437 dated the 14th. June, 1915 stating for the information of the Council of the Ballinasloe No. 1. Rural District, that the Board have received and accepted the resignation of Mr. R. W. Finney of his office of Rural District Councillor.

THE COUNCIL DECLARED Mr. FINNEY'S OFFICE VACANT, WHICH WAS SIGNED BY THE CHAIRMAN, TWO MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL, AND COUNTERSIGNED BY THE CLERK, AND ORDERED THAT NOTICE BE PUBLISHED THAT THE COUNCIL WILL PROCEED TO CO-OPT A MEMBER IN Mr. FINNEY'S PLACE ON THE 17th. INSTANT.

Letter from the Local Government Board No. 34,934 dated the 25th-June, 1915 referring to the Council's Minutes of the 19th. instant, and stating that they have areas approved of the proposal that the salary for the office of Assistant Clerk be fixed at £65 a year, rising by triennial increments of £5 until a maximum of £80 a year is reached, and that the salary be allocated as follows, namely, £30 to be payable by the Board of Guardians, £25 to be payable by the No. 1. Letter from the Local Government Board No. 29,575 dated the 31st. May, 1915 forwarding to be laid before the Council extracts from the Medical Officers' Returns, Forms L, relating to the Ahascragh, Ballinasloe, and Lawrencetown Dispensary Districts for the half-year ended the 31st. March last, and requesting that the matters therein referred to may receive the careful consideration of the District Gouncil.

AHASCRAGH DISPENSARY DISTRICT.

The Sewerage is defective at Ahascragh. Nuisances are caused by accumulations of manure too close to the dwellings in the District. NOTED.

BALLINASLOE DISPENSARY DISTRICT.

The water supply of the District is good, except in Mackney Village.

LAWRENCETOWN DISPENSARY DISTRICT.

A water supply is required at Killeveney Lawrencetown, the pump at Oghilbeg at present remains in an unfinished state.

The Severage is defective at Lawrencetown in the District. ORDERED /- THAT THE CONTRACTOR FOR THE OGHILBEG PUMP BE WRITTEN TO PROCEED WITH THE WORK WITHOUT ANY FURTHER DELAY, AND THAT ADVERTISEMENT BE ISSUED FOR CONTRACTORS FOR THE KYLEMORE AND KILLEVENEY PUMPS.

It was ORDERED /- THAT THE CONTRACTOR FOR KEEPING THE PUMPS IN REPAIR, GET THE HANDLE OF THE ERVALLOUGH PUMP FROM MATTHIAS NOLAN, AND HAVE SAME PUT RIGHT.

Sanitary Sub-Officer Hession reported that his District was free from contagious disease, that he would recommend that the drain leading from the back of James Broderick's premises at Ahascragh be cleaned as it is in an unsanitary state, and dangerous to public health.

REFERRED TO Mr. DUNNE THE COUNCIL'S ENGINEER, AND THE COUNTY SURVEYOR FOR A REFORT.

Sanitary Sub-Officer Connor reported that his District is clean and healthy, that the pump at Ballymana is in a bad state with the flags loose and the water going back again into the well it would require to be cemented.

ORDERED /- THAT THE SANITARY SUB-OFFICER GET THE WORK DONE, COST NOT TO EXCEED TWENTY SHILLINGS.

Sanitary Sub-Officer Connor further reported that the graveyard at Lawrencetown is in a very bad state with weeds and bushes, and that they require to be cut.

ORDERED /- THAT Mr. CONNOR GET THE WORK DONE.

BALLINAMONA PUMP.

Dr. A. C. Callaghan, Medical Officer of Health reported that the pump at Ballinamona requires to be cleaned and repaired. / ORDERED /- THAT THE GONTRACTOR HAVE THIS PUMP CLEANED AND REPAIRED AT A COST NOT TO EXCEED £4. 18. 0.

ARREARS OF RENT ON COTTAGE AND PLOT. THE COUNCIL UNAN IMOUSLY AND REPEATEDLY DECIDED THAT KELLY DOES NOW OWE ANY ARREARS. IN FACE OF ALL THESE FACTS AND IN FACE OF THE FACT THAT THE AUDITOR LAST JANUARY STATED HE WOULD NOT OBJECT TO THE COURSE WE ASK THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD TO ADOPT BEING TAKEN BY THE COUNCIL, THAT IS WRITING OFF SUCH ARREARS AS REBRESENT THE ADDED SIX PENCE PER WEEK. WE ONCEMORE EARNESTLY REQUEST THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD TO SANCTION THE COURSE WE PROPOSE AS WE BELIEVE ANY OTHER COURSE WOULD BE THE CAUSE OF THE GREATEST INJUSTICE. Letter from the Local Covernment Board No. 35,786 : 4945 dated 30th. June, 4945 referring to previous correspondence on the subject and informing the Council that they have sanctioned the appointment of Mr. T. J. Gill as Executive Sanitary Officer in the Rural District at a salary at the rate of £15. 12. 0. a year as proposed by the Council, and enclosing a copy of the Board's Sanitary Order No. 1 of the 3rd. May, 1900.

AUGHRIM NEW BURIAL GROUND.

Read a letter from Messrs Hayden & Taylor dated the 31st. July, 1915 stating that they have gone very carefully in to the above, and advising the Council to take the alternative site. The one selected at the end of the field would not, in their opinion be sanctioned by the Local Government Board there being two cottages already on the lands : the putting of a site for a grave-yard also on the same field would be deemed to interfere with the Occupiers' interest. The alternative Site is more convenient to Aughrim, and placing the Site beside the wall already bounding the cottage sites and having a shorter frontage would mean a saving of about £100 to the Council, and dispenses with. at least two Lecal Government Board inquiries, and that no Provisional Order or confirming Act of Parliament will be required. As to the financing of the Scheme they would suggest to borrow the amount required from the Bank of Ireland, and have its repayment spread over a period of years repayable by annual instalments with the sanction of the Local Government Board.
