ORDERED/- That the Local Government Board be asked to express their sanction to the prices already fixed for grave spaces in the Killoran Burial-Ground, namely 18/- to persons who have burial-spaces in the old burial ground and £1. 10. 0. to all others, the Council wish to point out to the Board that the number of people who have claim on the old burial ground are very small.
