CLONIGNEY COTTAGE.

Read a letter from the District Inspector, R. I. O. Ballinasloe dated the 22nd. October, 1915 referring to the Clerk's communication as to alleged malicious damage to the above-named Cottage, and stating that it appears that this house has never been occupied and it is said that corn was threshed in it by a neighbouring farmer in the Autumn of 1914, and that the Police are unable to fix responsibility for the present condition of the house.

CLONIGNEY COTTAGE.

Mr. Dunne, the Council's Engineer submitted a specification for the necessary repairs to the Cottage, the approximate cost of same would be about £6. 10. 0. The specification having been read to the Council approved of same, and Ordered/- THAT ADVERTISEMENT BE ISSUED FOR THE WORK.

The tender of James Hughes, Killaan for laying a pipe drain to connect with existing built drain near the Pound at Kilconnell was accepted for the sum of £5. (Five pounds).

The Council had before them one tender for the Lissyegan pump from Matthias Nolan which they considered too high, and adjourned the matter for six months.

KILLORAN PUMP.

The Council on the recommendation of Father Naughton, and Mr. Patrick Whelan accepted the site offered by the Diocesan Trustees free of cost for a Site for above pump, and it was Ordered/- "That Advertisement be issued for Contractors, and that the Engineer make a specification for same."

HURNEY'S COTTAGE PLOT.

The Engineer reported that he met a Committee on the 7th. instant to inspect the defective drainage at the plot and he estimated that the cost of a pipe drain would be for pipes 15" in diameter would be £11. 18. 3. and for a built drain of size 15" X 12" would be £10. 4. 0.

The Council after some discussion made the following Order/:- "That Hurney be asked if he would either make a built or "spiked" drain for the sum of £4. 18. 0. to proceed with the work, and if not that Advertisement be issued for Contractors, tenders for same to be taken on the 19th. instant."

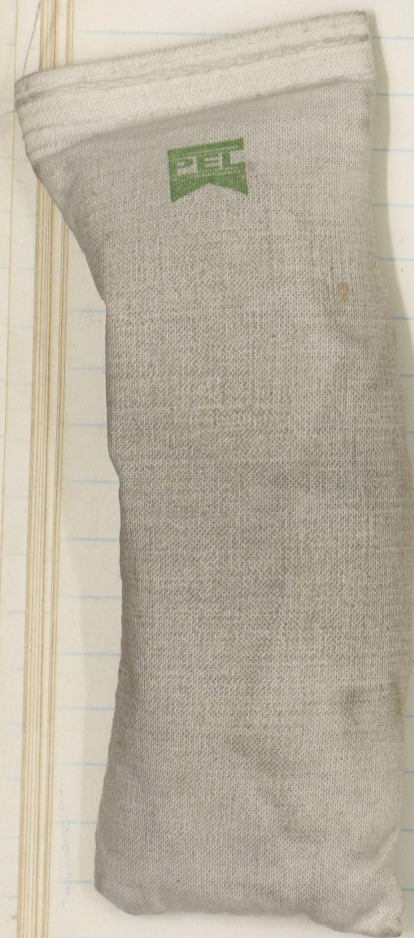
