"A large number of micro-organisms present, this is a very inferior "water, and one which it would be safer to use if previously boiled."

The Council's Engineer reported that, the quantity of water in Cappa Well remains plentiful. The concreting of the floor of well recommended in my previous report has not yet been carried out and the Well is thus liable to pollution. The boundary wall also reported on has not yet been re-built.

PROPOSED WELL AT BALLACH.

Mr. Dunne reported that in the 7th. instant he met a Committee of the Council at Ballagh re proposed well. The Well has been sunk to a depth of 12 feet, 8 feet being through gravel, and 4 feet through rock.


KULLORAN PUMP.
