The Council pursuant to Notice to each Member had before them copies of Resolutions passed by the Galway County Council declaring that all the reads in the Ballinasloe Rural District be suitable to be maintained by Direct Labour under the charge of the County Surveyor, and that the County Surveyor's scheme be approved of, when the resolution was passed subject to Mr. Hoban's motion re appointments of Gangers, Surfacemen &c be adopted.

Mr. Hoban then moved his motion which was passed unanimously as follows:-

"I beg to give notice that I will move on the 11th. "March that the Rural District Council have full control of "appointing Surfacemen, Gangers, &c., under the Direct Labour "Scheme."

The Council also adopted the resolution of the County Council in making a final declaration concerning main roads, to wit, that the existing division of roads into "main" and "District" be abolished, and that all road expenditure be charged to the District in which it is incurred, and that the Declaration come into operation as from the 1st. April, 1916.

The Council took no action on a letter received from Hev. J. Fallon, Clontouskert Ballinasloe relative to the recent Co-option of a Member on the Council, and the Chairman adjourned the Meeting to the 25th, March, 1916; -:-:- W&Dowling
