Read a letter from Mr. M. L. Colohan, Solicitor Ballinaslee objecting on behalf of the ratepayers with the site selected for the proposed sinking of a well and erecting a pump at Ballagh on the grounds of it not being centrally situated. ✓

Dr. Egan reported that the houses occupied by John Barrett Liscunq, William Connell Newtown, Thomas Mannion Garrymore, and Lawrence Byrne are in an insanitary condition for the want of linewashing.

REPAIRS TO AHASCRAUGH GRAVE-YARD.

The Council accepted the tender of William Keogh for the building and repairing the boundary wall at Ahascragh grave-yard for the sum of £88. 10. 0. ✓

Letter from the Local Government Board No. L 7096 : 1916 dated the 7th. September, 1916 referring to the Council's resolution of the 26th. ultimo proposing to allow a sum of £1 each to the tenants for repairing the defective chimneys of the cottages which they hold from the Council under the Labourers Acts, and stating that they cannot approve of the employment of the tenants (who are merely labourers) for the carrying out of works of this nature, which should be done by competent contractors or tradesmen.

The Council should instruct their Engineer to prepare a specification of the required works and then invite tenders for the execution thereof under his supervision.

KILCRIN COTTAGE.

The Rent Collector further reported that Thomas Brennan of Skycur owes £2. 12. 0. & THOMAS HARDIMAN Knockaun £1. 6. 0. which they refuse to pay owing to their cottages being in bad repair.

ORDERED/- THAT THE CONTRACTORS FOR KEEPING THESE COTTAGES IN REPAIR BE REQUESTED TO CARRY OUT THE WORK.
