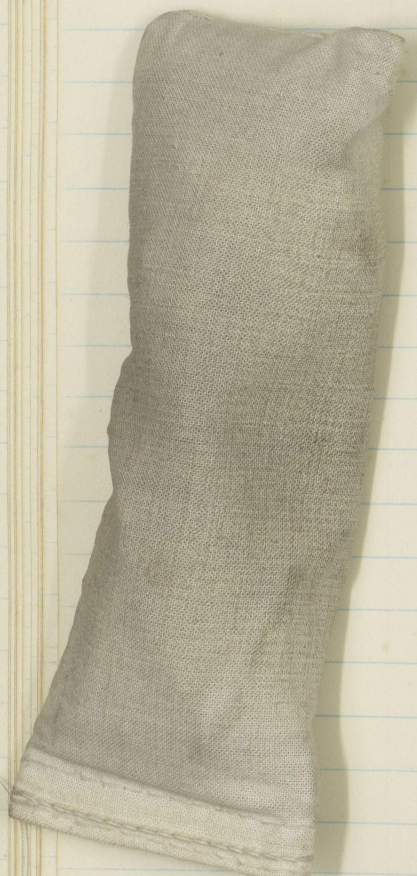

Read a further letter from the Congested Districts Board dated the 23rd. February, 1917 calling attention to their communication of the 23rd. January last, on the subject of Oatfield Pump.

THE CLERK STATED THAT AS ORDERED BY THE COUNCIL HE COMMUNICATED WITH Messrs Michael Flaherty, and Michael Dolan FOR A REPORT AS TO WHETHER A PUMP WAS REQUIRED IN THE LOCALITY OR NOT, AND TO WHICH HE RECEIVED NO REPLY. THE COUNCIL THEN TOOK NO FURTHER ACTION. ✓

Read a letter from Mr. Connolly Ahascragh in reply to the Council's letter of the 20th. December last relative to the drain at the back of his premises and stating that the cleaning of the drain is no business of his, and that both his yard and slaughter house are clean and sanitary at all times, and which the Medical Officer of Health can vouch, and calling upon the Council to have the drain cleaned. ORDERED/- THAT Mr. Connolly's letter be referred to Dr. Callaghan, Medical Officer of Health for a report.

Letter from the Local Government Board No. L 970 : 1916 dated the 1st. February, 1917 calling attention to their circular letter of the 21st. November last, respecting the full cultivation of plots of land provided under the Labourers Acts; and stating that the Board consider that the Rural District Council should require their rent collectors to furnish them with reports, on dates set out therein.

THE CLERK INFORMED THE COUNCIL THAT HE SENT A COPY OF THE BOARD'S LETTER TO THE RENT COLLECTOR ON THE 6th. INSTANT, AND THAT HE FORWARDED THE COLLECTOR'S REPORT TO THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD.

Read a letter from Messrs Hayden & Taylor, Ballinasloe, dated the 23rd. January, 1917, which was adjourned from last Meeting, stating that the Estates Commissioners are anxious to purchase the Cottage and plot whatever sum the Council paid for the plot and house subject of course to the sanction of the Local Government Board being obtained.

THE COUNCIL ACCEDED TO THE REQUEST OF THE ESTATES COMMISSIONERS SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL AND SANCTION OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD.

Read a letter from Messrs Hayden & Taylor, Solicitors, Ballinasloe dated the 24th. February, 1917 stating that there was only one Magistrate at Lawrencetown Petty Session, so the possession cases, could not be heard, and were adjourned to next Court day.

Mr. HAYDEN WHO WAS PRESENT AT THE MEETING, ASSURED THE COUNCIL THAT HE WOULD SECURE THE NECESSARY MAGISTRATES FOR NEXT SESSION.

Read a letter from Michael Reddin asking the Council to have his cottage transferred to his brother Edward, and stating that his sureties will enter into a bond for his brother, the Council agreed to the transfer being made.

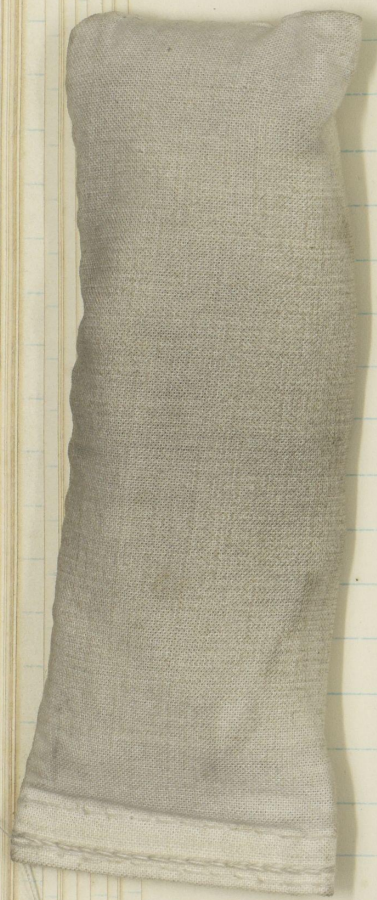
