Letter from the Local Government Board No. 5412: 1917 dated the 13th. March, 1917 referring to previous correspondence on the subject and forwarding for the guidance of the Council copy of an Order declaring what roads in the County Galway shall be main roads within the meaning of Section 8 of the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898 as from the 1st. proximo.
