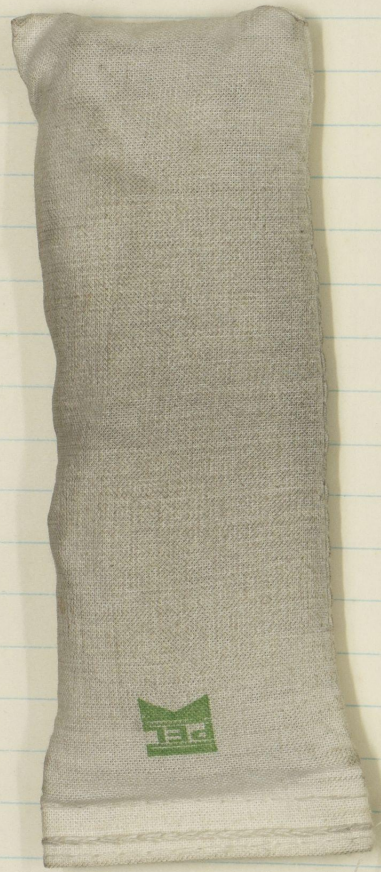

REPORT TO THE BALLINASLOE

RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Mr Chairman, My Lady & Gentlemen,

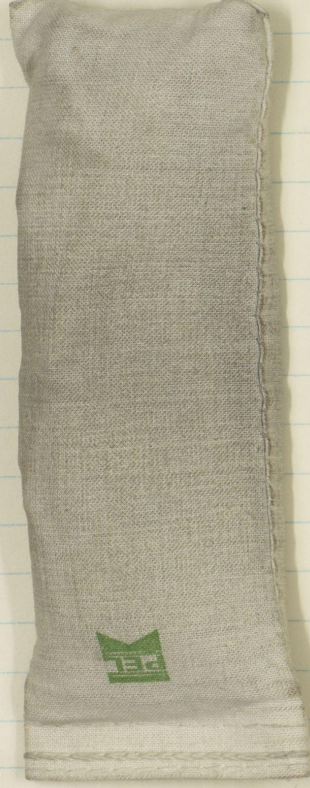
In submitting you my recommendations for payment on Form 22., I beg to state, that I have been again compelled to defer a considerable amount of the money available for payment to Contractors.

There has been no serious attempt made by contractors to earn the sums of money accumulated on their contracts by previous defers.

It is obvious that the important work of road maintenance is only getting a very poor consideration from your contractors, being in all cases postponed until a few days before the quarterly meeting, when it is then rushed and done in a slovenly manner. As you are aware successful road making is only accomplished by careful and continual surface attention.

I have made application for the renewal of the expiring road contracts, which I have amalgamated into Groups and Sections, so as to conform with the new Direct Labour Scheme, which will start on the 1st July next. In estimating the cost of maintenance of these Groups and Sections, it was necessary to advance the price by 20% above that originally laid down in the Scheme; owing to the sudden and increased cost of labour; consequently it is incumbent on me to ask you increase my estimate by at least

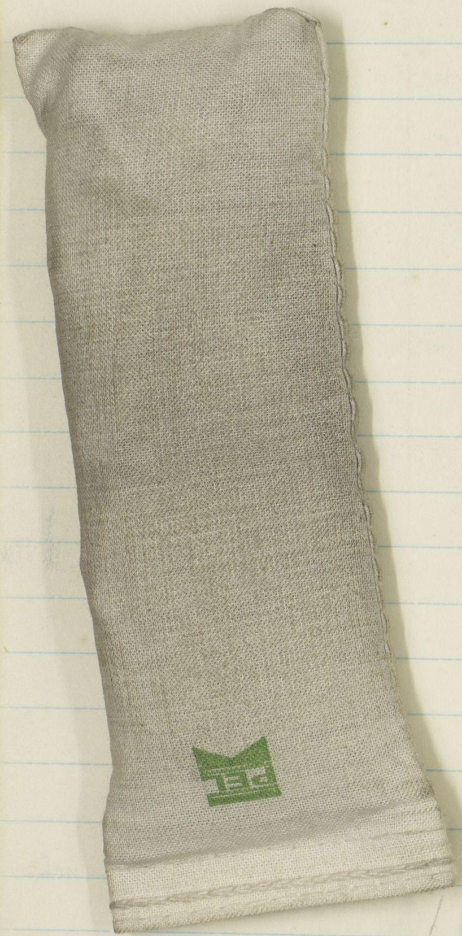

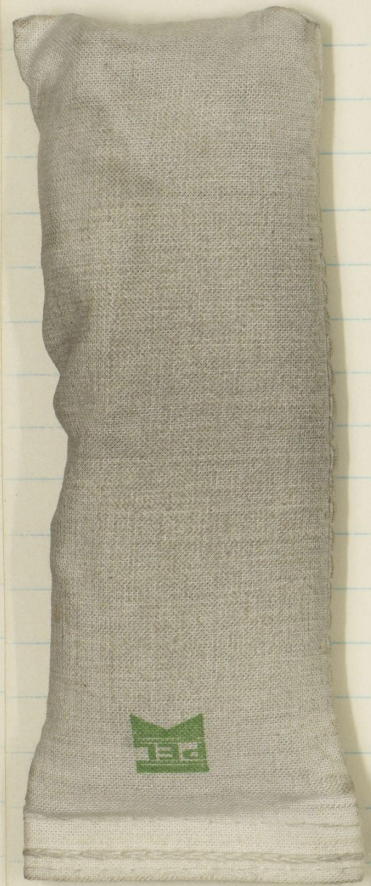

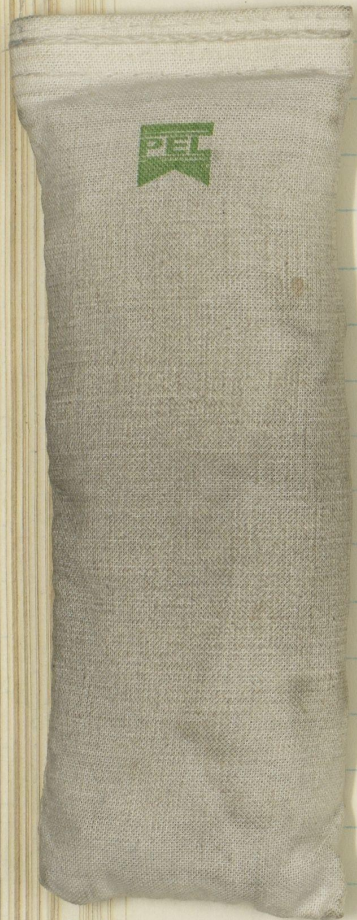
Mr. McDermott pursuant to his Notice moved:- "THAT A LOAN OF £700 "BE OBTAINED FOR THE COMPLETION OF THE CLONFERT NEW ROAD" and Mrs GAVIN seconded the motion. ✓

Mr. Dowling, proposed, and Mr. Parker Seconded "That the £700 "asked for by Mr. McDermott for the Clonfert New Road be not granted "until after the War."

The Chairman having taken a vote on the question declared Mr. McDermott's motion carried by 7 votes to 4, and the Clerk was directed to send a minute of same on to the County Council. ✓

Read a letter from the Secretary Galway County Council dated the 9th. May, 1917 stating that the County Council had under consideration the question of the daily wages paid to labourers and carters employed on the public roads of the County. The following proposal was made:- Labourers 3/4 per day, and carters (including horse) 7/6 per day, and requesting the views of the District Council on the matter. ✓
