
Mr Chairman, My Lady & Gentlemen,



### SPECIAL MEETING OF COUNCIL.

The Clerk stated that the Meeting was specially convened to discuss the Scheme for Direct Labour.

Read a letter from the County Surveyor dated the 3rd. May, 1917 replying to the Clerk's letter of the 30th. ultimo, and stating that as the Scheme for Direct Labour was formulated by Mr. M. J. Kennedy then County Surveyor for the Eastern Division, which was unanimously adopted by the Council and subsequently passed by the County Council, and endorsed by a Sealed Order from the Local Government Board, it would be utterly impossible for him to go back to the old contract system by again splitting up the roads.

After a lengthy discussion on the matter, Mr. W. E. Dowling,
proposed, and Mr. W. Supple seconded, and unanimously Resolved/"That we reseind the resolution of the 8th. January, 1916 introducing
"the Direct Labour into the Ballinasloe District Council No. 1. as our
"resolution was pa sed when labour was much cheaper and more easily
"available, and on the undertaking by the County Surveyor, Mr. Kennedy
"that the Direct Labour system would not entail any additional expense
"and we request the Local Government Board to sanction this course
"and that a copy of this resolution be sent to the County Council
"for adoption."

ORDERED - THAT ALL ROADS EXPIRING ON THE 30th. JUNE, 1917 BE HANDED OVER TO THE COUNTY SURVEYOR FOR THREE MONTHS, UNTIL SEPETMBER 30th. WITH REQUEST THAT WHERE CONTRACTORS WISH TO CONTINUE FOR THREE MONTHS THEY BE ALLOWED TO DO SO. THAT TONNAGE ON THE ROADS BE REDUCED AND THE ESTI ATE NOT BE INCREASED.

The application of the County Surveyor for an invrease of £850 in his Estimate was on the motion of Mr. T. P. Killeen, Seconded by Mr. T. Cahill, unanimously refused.

On the motion of Mr. Cahill, Seconded by Mr. Dowling, it was unanimously Resolved/- That the Local Government Board Be asked to give their immediate Reply to the council's Order of the 28th. APRIL, 1917 CALLING FOR A SWORN INQUIRY INTO THE UNEXPENDED BALANCE OF £167 ON THE CLONFERT NEW ROAD.

AND THAT Mr. COSCROVE, M. P. BE ASKED TO ASCERTAIN IN THE HOUSE OF COMMONS AS TO WHY THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD DID NOT REPLY TO THE COUNCIL'S ORDER OF THE 28th. ULTIMO.

Mr. McDermott pursuant to his Notice moved:- "THAT A LOAN OF \$700 "BE OBTAINED FOR THE COMPLETION OF THE CLONFERT NEW ROAD" and Mrs GAVIN seconded the motion.

Mr. Dowling, proposed, and Mr. Parker Seconded "That the £700" asked for by Mr. McDermott for the Clonfert New Road be not granted "until after the War."

The Chairman having taken a vote on the question declared Mr. McDermott's motion carried by 7 votes to 4, and the Clerk was directed to send a minute of same on to the County Council.

Read a letter from the Secretary Galway County Council dated the 9th. May, 1917 stating that the County Council had under consideration the question of the daily wages paid to labourers and carters employed on the public roads of the County. The following proposal was made:— Labourers 3/4 per day, and carters (including horse) 7/6 per day, and requesting the views of the District Council on the matter.
