#### ATTYCOFFEY PUMP.

The Council had before them 2 tenders for the sinking of a well and erection of a pump at Attycoffey one from Mr. Peter M'Keigue, and the other from Messirs Campbell & Sons, Artesian Pump Sinkers, when on the motion of the Chairman, Seconded by Mr. Carty the tender of Mr. Peter M'Keigue was accepted.

#### CORRANGENA PUMP.

The Clerk read a letter from Messrs Supple and Lynskey stating that they selected a site at Corraneena on Mr. Glynn's land, and if the Council approve of same, that Mr. Glynn's permission be sought.

Dr. Callaghan Medical Officer of Health of the Ahascragh District reported the following people hawing manure too close to their dwellings: - Michael Moclair, Dan Murray, and Mrs Brien.

Dr. Rossiter Medical Officer of Health Ballinasloe Dispensary
District reported that the house occupied by Bridget Crowe of Aughrim
and the house occupied by Mary Murray of Aughrim require limewashing
and thatching.

ORDERED/- THAT THE USUAL NOTICES BE SERVED.

Dr. Callaghan Medical Officer of Health of the Ahascragh Dispensary District reported 4 cases of Scarlet Fever, and that the necessary precautions were taken.

Dr. Egan Medical Officer of Health of the Killaan Dispensary District reported that the house of Patrick Murphy Garrymore is in an unsanitary condition and requires that ching and limewashing. That the house of Thomas Broderick is entirely unfit for habitation being most dangerous and partly flooded, and recommending same be closed as it could not be made habitable. That Miss Finn's yard at Kilconnell is repeatedly flooded and is a danger to the public health. That the house occupied by Patrick Barrett of Liscune is in a very unsanitary condition requiring that ch and limewashing, and is in fact of danger falling in.

Letter from the Local Government Board No. L 8754: 1917 dated the 3rd. September, 1917 referring to the Council's Minutes of the 28th. July, 1917 pointing out that the collection of the cottage rents is not satisfactory.

ORDERED/- THAT THE COLLECTOR TAKE THE NECESSARY STEPS TO HAVE ALL ARREARS OF RENT COLLECTED.

Letter from the Local Government Board No. L8966: 1917 dated the 4th. September, 1917 referring to the Clerk's letter of the 29th. ultimo and stating that they will raise no objection to the sum proposed to be paid to Mr. Cahill in connection with the repair of cottages provided under the Labourers Acts as set out in the Council's Minutes of the 28th. July last.

Letter from the Local Government Board No. L9,294/12/1917 dated the 19th. September, 1917 acknowledging receipt of returns on forms "C" and "D" in relation to the Loans of £4.275 and £850 and requesting that the Board may be furnished with a detailed report from the Council's Engineer as to the remedying of the defects in the cottages referred to in the report of the Board's Architect (Mr. Foley) of the 19th. May 1915.

THE CLERK STATED THAT HE SENT A COPY OF THE BOARD'S LETTER TO Mr.
DUNNE (ENGINEER TO THE COUNCIL) WITH A VIEW TO HE FURNISHING THE
INFORMATION REQUIRED BY THE BOARD.

Letter from the Local Government Board No. L9246: 1917 dated the 19th. September, 1917 referring to previous correspondence relative to Maxabana the proposal to allow Mr. Dunne a slary of £100 per armum for the carrying out of all Engineering work in connection with the Council, and stating that they will maise no objection to Mr. Dunne's

employment for one year from the 25th. ultimo at a salary of £75 to include all expenses.

The Clerk read a lengthy report on the dilapidated condition of the Moaty Cottage from Mr. Dunne, when after a discussion it was Ordered/- THAT THE CONTRACTOR AND HIS SURETIES BE NOTIFIED THAT IF THE WORK BE NOT DONE BY NEXT MONTH IT WILL BE DONE AT THEIR EXPENSE.

Ordered/- That Mr. Cahill be communicated with to have the necessary repairs carried out to the cottage situate at Crummagh, occupied by a Mrs Mooney, and that Mr. Dunne (Engineer) inspect and report to next Meeting on the condition of Barry, Hardiman, and Brennan's cottages.

The application of the Rent Collector for £2. 15. 0. out of pocket expenses in connection with attending Sessions, taking up possession of cottages &c was granted subject to the approval and sanction of the Local Government Board.

The Council directed proceedings to be instituted against the following tenants in arrear of rent: - Michael Fallon 13/- James Hynes 13/- Thomas Baker 19/- Michael Barry 19/6 Patrick Daly 19/6 Annie Mooney Crum. El. 1. 8. Martin Earls 26/- and that Notice to Quit be served on Michael Kelly of Carrownea.

The Rent Collector reported 23 cottages in need of repair, when the Clerk was directed to communicate with the Maintenance Contractors to have these cottages attended to immediately.
