Mr. Egan submitted his report on the state of the Dairy Cows in his District which was of a satisfactory nature, and approved of by the Council. ✓

Dr. Rossiter, Medical Officer of Health, Ballinasloe reported the occurrence of a case of Scarlatina, at Liscappul, Aghrim. ✓

Read a letter from the Rev. P. J. Shanagher relative to the English Burial-ground ruin, and stating that he is yet unable to obtain accurate information as to its tradition, but is yet inquiring into the matter. ✓

The Committee appointed to select the Site for a pump at Atty coffey submitted their report which was approved of by the Council and Ordered/- That Mr. Dunne inspect the Site, and if same is suitable for the erection of a pump and sinking a well, that the Clerk issue advertisement, tenders to be considered at next Meeting. ✓

A Memorial was read from the inhabitants of Corraneena requesting the Council to supply them with a pump, when the Clerk was directed to summon a meeting of the Members of the Kilconnell Dispensary District to meet at Corraneena on Sunday the 9th. September, 1917 at the hour of 3 O'Clock in the afternoon. ✓

Dr. Fair Medical Officer of Health reported the occurrence of a case of Enteric Fever at Amallala. ✓

Dr. Fair Medical Officer of Health reported the unsanitary state of a vacant labourers' cottage at Moaty, when the matter was referred to Sub-Sanitary Officer Connor to be cleaned. ✓

The Notice of motion standing in the name of Mr. Patrick Whelan relative to the salary of the Caretaker of the Killalaghtan Burial Ground was adjourned for twelve months. ✓

Read a letter from Mr. John McKeigue, D. O. stating that the Cottage in Dooras lately taken by a man named Michael Pardy is in a very bad condition, all the windows are broken, shed blown down, and some of the roof gone.

REFERRED TO THE COUNCIL'S ENGINEER FOR A REPORT TO NEXT MEETING. ✓

Read a letter from Michael Barry, Maintenance Contractor asking the Council to give him until the 15th. September, 1917 for the completion of his contract, and to stay proceedings until then.

BARRY WAS ALLOWED THREE WEEKS TO COMPLETE HIS CONTRACT. ✓

Read a letter from Mrs Mary Blehein of Carrahulla Woodlawn complaining of the state of her cottage, and which was referred to the Engineer for a report. ✓

Complaints of cottages were also read from Michael Reddin of Ballinakill, and John Hardiman of Knockaun which were referred to the cottage maintenance contractor. ✓

Ordered/- That Messrs Kelly and McKeigue have the fence made up around the cottage at Dooras, payment to be made on their certificate, the cottage being now vacant. ✓

Ordered/- That Patrick Colohan be notified to pay his rent of his cottage each month in future, and that payment will not be taken from him as heretofore. ✓

Letter from the Local Government Board No. L 8520 : 1917 dated the 20th. August, 1917 referring to the Clerk's letter of the 15th. instant and the Council's Minutes of the 28th. ultimo, and requesting what sums have already been paid Mr. Cahill, and asking for the Engineer's opinion respecting Mr. Cahill's claim. ✓

The Clerk stated that he informed the Local Government Board of the amount of money paid Mr. Cahill, and that Mr. Dunne was furnished with a copy of the Board's letter, with a request to furnish the information asked for therein.

ATTYCOFFEY PUMP.

The Council had before them 2 tenders for the sinking of a well and erection of a pump at Attycoffey one from Mr. Peter M'Keigue, and the other from Messrs Campbell & Sons, Artesian Pump Sinkers, when on the motion of the Chairman, Seconded by Mr. Carty the tender of Mr. Peter M'Keigue was accepted. ✓

CORRANEENA PUMP.

The Clerk read a letter from Messrs Supple and Lynskey stating that they selected a site at Corraneena on Mr. Glynn's land, and if the Council approve of same, that Mr. Glynn's permission be sought.

THE COUNCIL APPROVED OF THE SITE SELECTED, AND THAT Mr. GLYNN BE COMMUNICATED WITH ON THE MATTER. ✓

Dr. Callaghan Medical Officer of Health of the Ahascragh District reported the following people having manure too close to their dwellings:- Michael Moclair, Dan Murray, and Mrs Brien.

ORDERED/- SERVE USUAL NOTICE.

Dr. Rossiter Medical Officer of Health Ballinasloe Dispensary District reported that the house occupied by Bridget Crowe of Auhrim and the house occupied by Mary Murray of Auhrim require limewashing and thatching.

ORDERED/- THAT THE USUAL NOTICES BE SERVED.

Dr. Callaghan Medical Officer of Health of the Ahascragh Dispensary District reported 4 cases of Scarlet Fever, and that the necessary precautions were taken.

Dr. Egan Medical Officer of Health of the Killaan Dispensary District reported that the house of Patrick Murphy Garrymore is in an unsanitary condition and requires thatching and limewashing. That the house of Thomas Broderick is entirely unfit for habitation being most dangerous and partly flooded, and recommending same be closed as it could not be made habitable. That Miss Finn's yard at Kilconnell is repeatedly flooded and is a danger to the public health. That the house occupied by Patrick Barrett of Liscune is in a very unsanitary condition requiring thatch and limewashing, and is in fact of danger falling in.

THE CLERK WAS DIRECTED TO HAVE THE NECESSARY NOTICES SERVED IN EACH CASE.

Ordered/- That the pump at Clonfert and the pump at Abbeylands be cleaned at a cost not to exceed £5. 10. 0 for the two

employment for one year from the 25th. ultimo at a salary of £75 to include all expenses.

The Clerk read a lengthy report on the dilapidated condition of the Moaty Cottage from Mr. Dunne, when after a discussion it was Ordered/- THAT THE CONTRACTOR AND HIS SURETIES BE NOTIFIED THAT IF THE WORK BE NOT DONE BY NEXT MONTH IT WILL BE DONE AT THEIR EXPENSE.

Ordered/- That Mr. Cahill be communicated with to have the necessary repairs carried out to the cottage situate at Crummagh, occupied by a Mrs Mooney, and that Mr. Durne (Engineer) inspect and report to next Meeting on the condition of Barry, Hardiman, and Breman's cottages.

The application of the Rent Collector for £2. 15. 0. out of pocket expenses in connection with attending Sessions, taking up possession of cottages &c was granted subject to the approval and sanction of the Local Government Board.

The Council directed proceedings to be instituted against the following tenants in arrear of rent:- Michael Fallon 13/- James Hynes 13/- Thomas Baker 19/- Michael Barry 19/6 Patrick Daly 19/6 Annie Mooney Crum. £1. 1. 8. Martin Earls 26/- and that Notice to Quit be served on Michael Kelly of Carrownea.

The Rent Collector reported 33 cottages in need of repair, when the Clerk was directed to communicate with the Maintenance Contractors to have these cottages attended to immediately.
