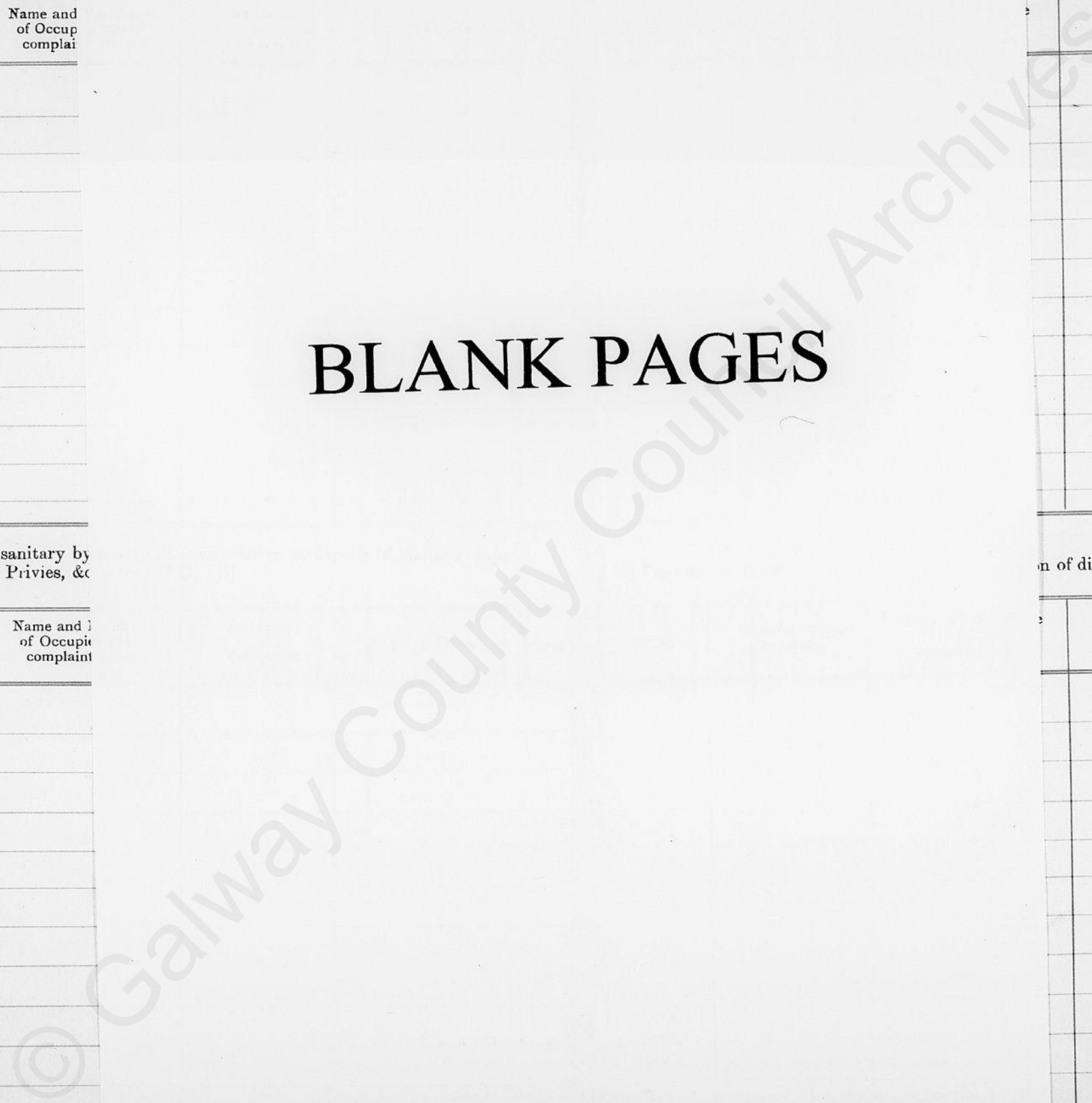

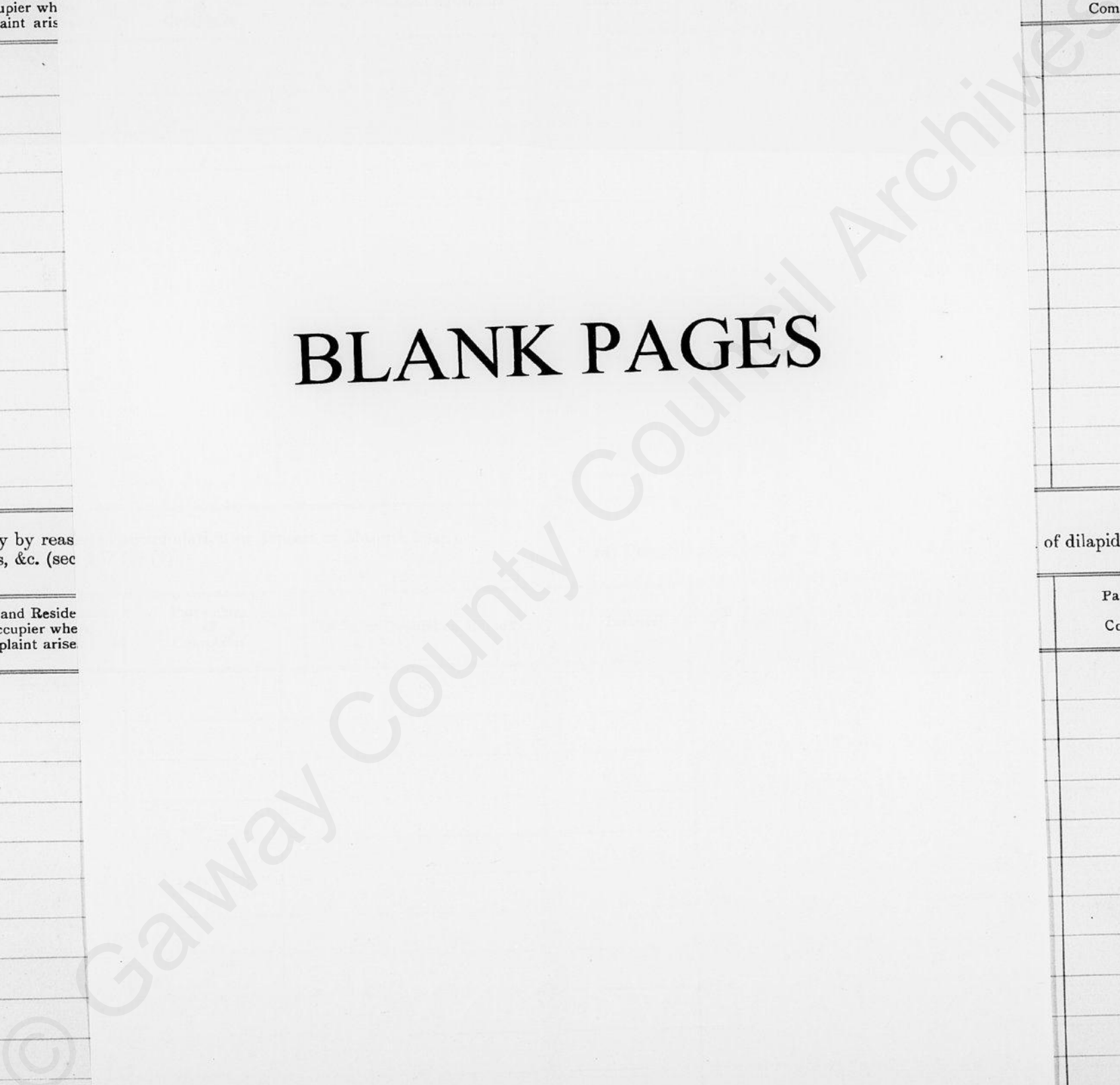

to order you to increase the wages - it rests with you to decide - but they recommended the application to your favourable consideration.

The wages provided in the Direct Labour Scheme is 18/- per week for labourers. Then the Agricultural Wages Board, Ireland, after public inquiry fixed the Agricultural labourers' wages at 20/- per week, and it is considered fair that the road workers should also get that wage, and they have been working at that rate since then. The Agricultural wages ^{Board} held another inquiry in November last and fixed 26/- per week for Agricultural labourers and the road men expect to be paid at this increased rate, which at the present cost of living only corresponds to about 13/- per week five years ago. I consider the increase should be given.

If you agree to this amount and corresponding increase to gangers, carters, materials etc. then the amount to be provided in your estimate would be as follows :-

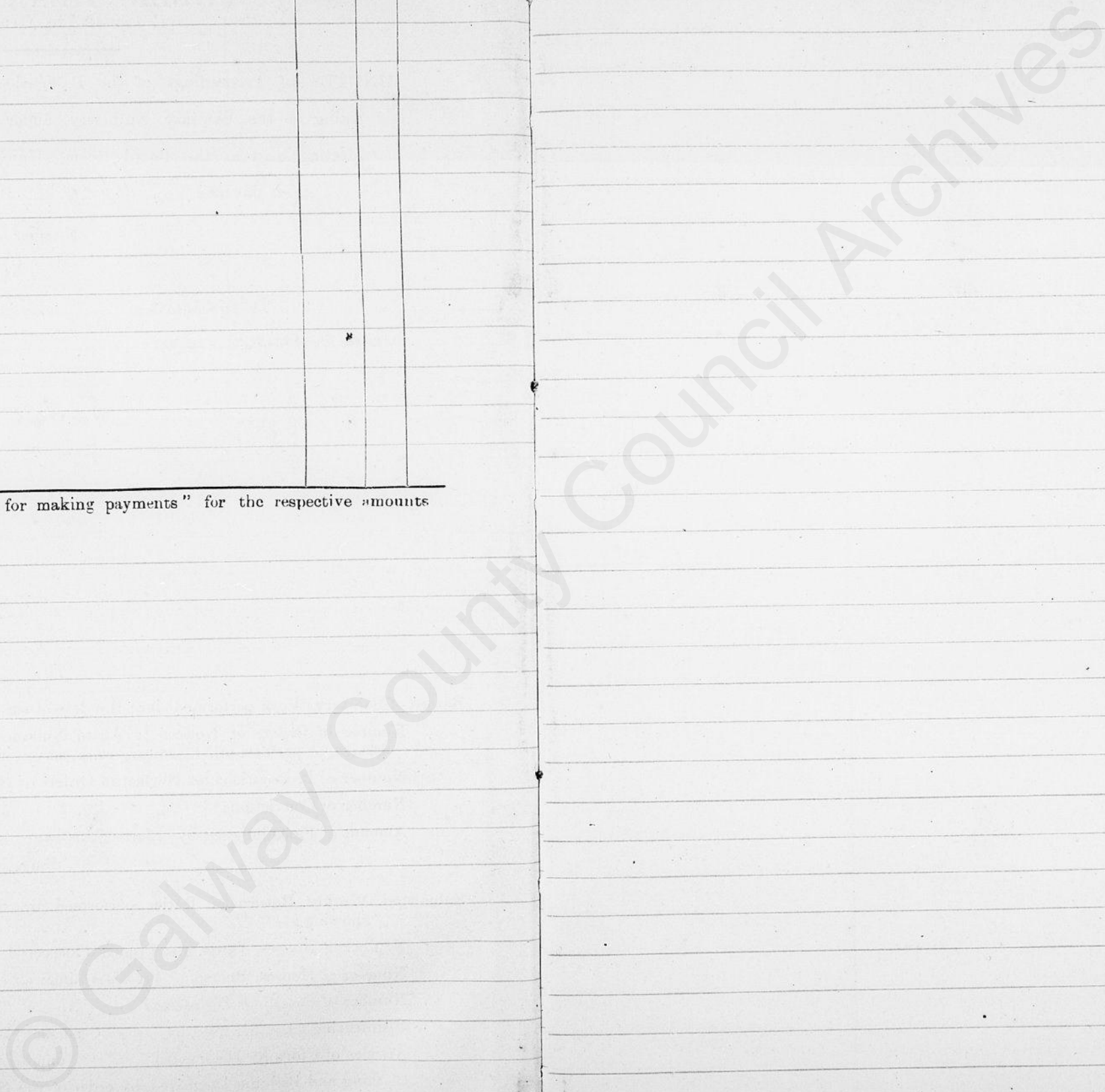

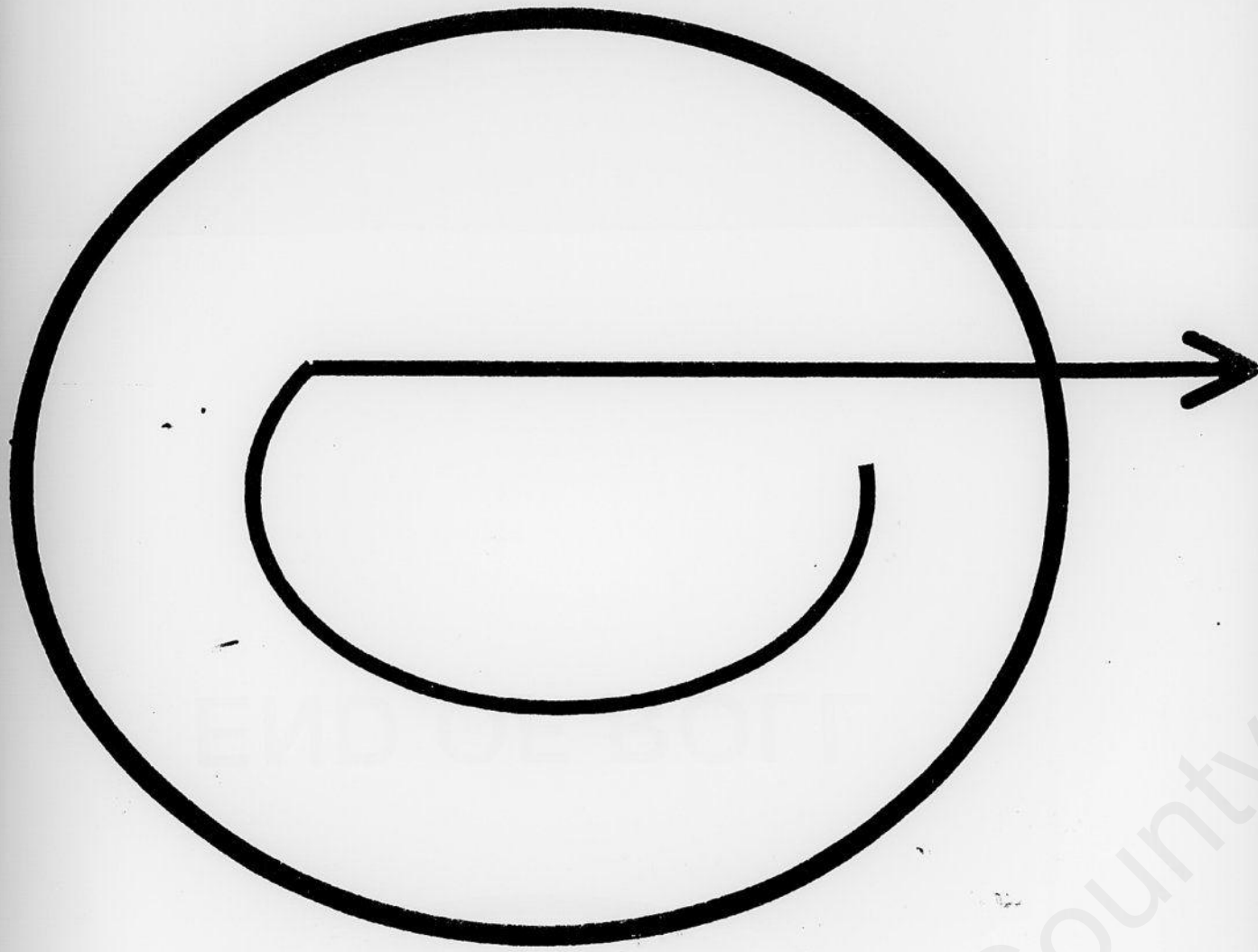
