 National Insurance Society, the ratepayers of the County  
 "having enough to do to meet the ordinary charges that have  
 "this year increased to such alarming proportions"

Gentlemen.

Herewith I return Form 22 in which I have entered my recommendations for proposals for payment and other decisions which I consider should be made by you in each case.

The condition of the Public Works Contracts in the District is indicated by the recommendations in Form 22 from which may be seen that out of 24 instalments of continuous road maintenance contracts deferred at last meeting 22 may be paid with some deductions and 2 must be struck off, and out of 29 instalments current for the quarter now being dealt with 25 may be paid in full, 3 in part paid, and 1 must be deferred in full. Also 8 instalments of Special Works deferred at last meeting may now be paid in part.

I recommend that these new contracts shall be entered into for only two years (to expire on 31<sup>st</sup> March, 1915), to enable you to adopt a Direct Labour Scheme for whichever roads in the District you may decide should be done by Direct Labour when the new scheme is being prepared.

The trees should be planted on the land side of the fence with the permission of owners and occupiers, and should be fenced for protection. The cost including fencing would be between £4 and £5 per dozen. Four dozen per mile half each side in zig zag arrangement would give a space of about 36 yards between each, and would cost about £18 per mile. I should like to see more trees along some roads, but I fear the expense would be considered rather great.

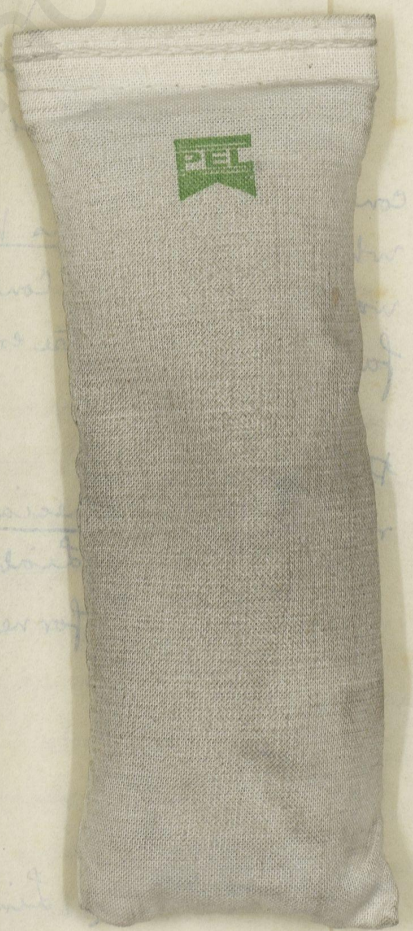
