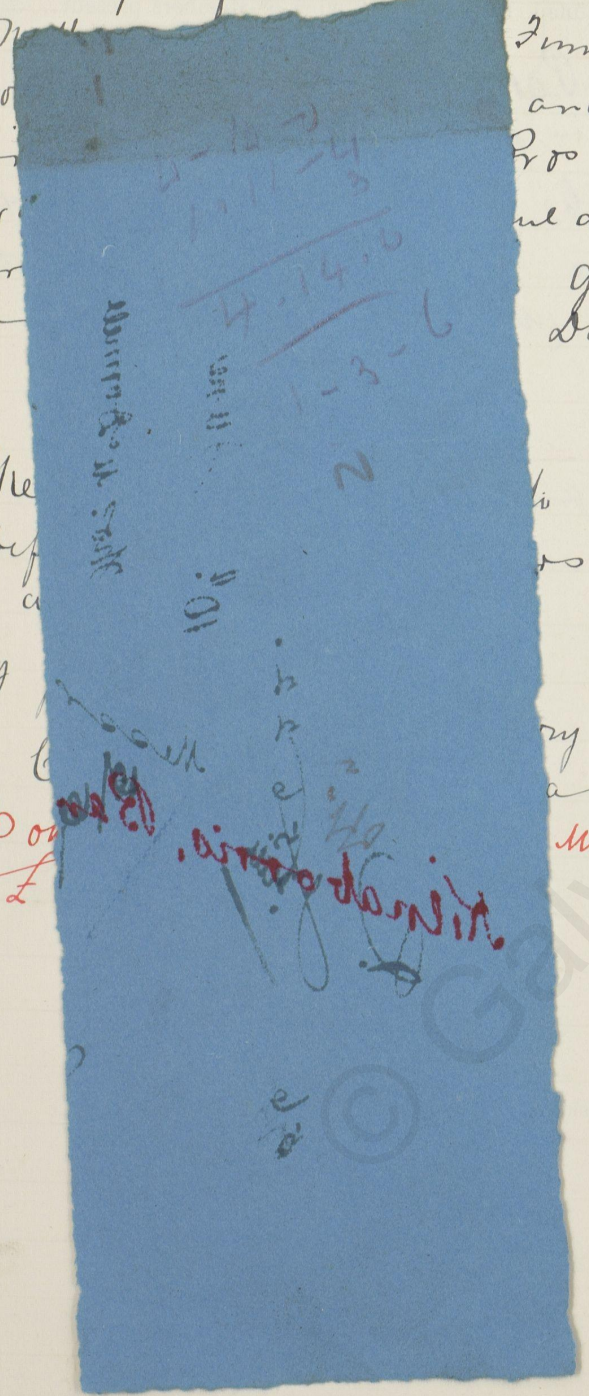

Gentlemen,

Herewith I return Form 22 in which I have entered my recommendations as to proposals for payment and other decisions which I consider should be made by you in each case.

The condition of the Public Works Contracts in the District is indicated by the recommendations in Form 22, from which may be seen that out of 3 instalments of Continuous Road Maintenance Contracts deferred at last Meeting 2 may now be paid with some deductions and 1 must be struck off. All of the 29 instalments current for the Quarter now being dealt with are recommended for payment in full or with small deductions.

Eight instalments of payments of Special Works Contracts deferred at last Meeting may now be paid off.

At the time of recent inspection the condition of the surfaces of the roads was fair or middling but the Contractors do not give enough attention to road surface

labour; it is a most necessary part of Road Maintenance, every Road Contractor should cross-scrape and cross-brush the road surface from time to time to obliterate or remove the two lines of wheel tracks which, without the attention specified, are sure to lead horses and drivers to follow in same tracks. Thus, all the wear occurs in the tracks, the surface cuts, becomes uneven, holds water in ruts, the road is seriously injured and then requires more labour and expense to repair the damage than would have sufficed to prevent it occurring; and, meantime, the people using the road are inconvenienced by its uneven surface, and, again, by the sort of repair at length given to it. Complaints about this are more frequent now than formerly, because, road users demand a better surface to travel over, and Contractors should read the instructions in their specifications and try as far as possible to carry them out. Otherwise, they need not expect to receive full payment of the contract amounts.

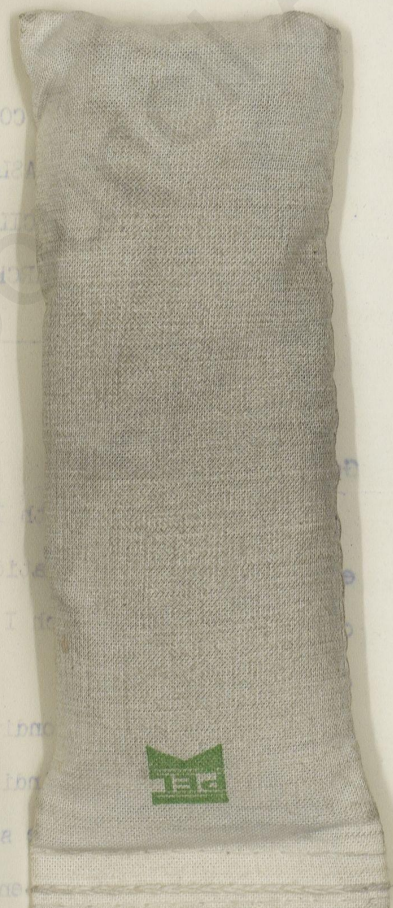
