Notton's Malicious Injury Claim

Messrs Hayden & Taylor, the Council's Solicitors, wrote stating that they attended at Roscommon Quarter Sessions on the 30th Sept 1913 when the C. C. Judge granted compensation and expenses amounting to £ 31. 13. 0. The Judge directed the amount to be levied off the E. D. of Taughmacormell in the Athlone Union and the E. D. of Taughbry in Mountbellew Union

Contracts was fair, or middling; but Contractors do not give sufficient labour to properly shape the carriageways. This is the season for such work and for banking up low margins with the surplus stuff from the edges. The road metal should be broken smaller; if road metal be broken to small size, most of the road surfaces can be repaired and kept smooth without inconveniencing the public traffic over them. I have several miles of roads in my own charge which are done in this way and they have surfaces just as smooth as the steam rolled roads. There is no reason why Contractors should not be equally successful if they give some attention to the work.

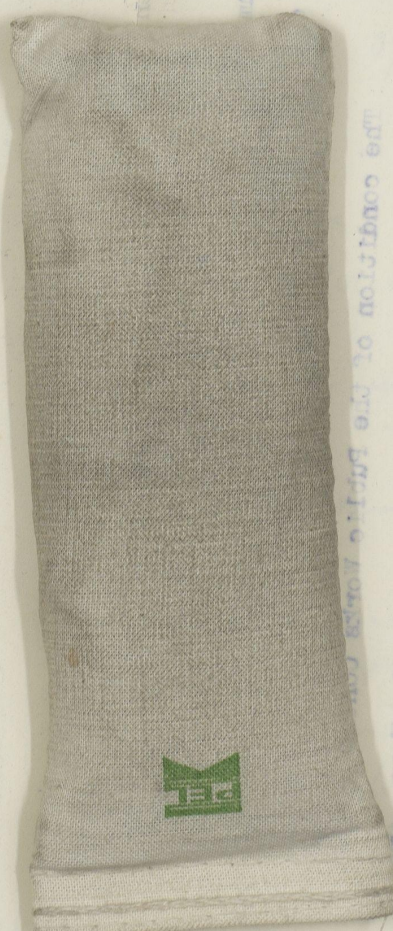
