Letterf from the L.G.Board No 55665 dated the 30th October,1913,

stating for the information of the Council that they have sanctioned the appointment of Mr Thomas.J.Gill as Assistant Clerk of the Union at a salary of £100 a year,of which £60 is as Assistant Clerk to the Board of Guardians £30 as Assistant Clerk to the No 1 Rural District Council and £10 as Assistant Clerk to the No 2 Rural District Council.

Circular Letter from the L.G.Board No L 10,863 dated the 12th November,1913,drawing attention to their Circular letter of the 8th August,1904,respecting the salaries of Union Officers, and stating that,in accordance with the recommendation made therein,several Boards of Guardians have since framed graded scales of salaries for their Officers,fixing a minimum salary, an increase by annual, triennial, or quinquennial increments,and the maximum to be ultimately attained; pointing out the advantage of such an arrangement;and suggesting that Boards of Guardians and Rural District Councils should now take into their consideration the advisability of formulating scales of salaries for the various Officers.

Consideration adjourned for the present.

Letter from Mr A.C.Ellis, Auditor, dated the 14th November,1913, notifying his intention to audit on the 19th December,the accounts of the Council for the half-year ended the 30th September last.

Messrs Hayden & Taylor,Solicitors to the Council,wrote under date the 15th October,1913,that they have been served with another notice of appeal in the case of John Norton's Malicious Injury Claim on behalf of the Mountbellew Rural District Council;and asking further instructions.

It was ORDERED - That the Solicitors watch the proceedings on behalf of the Council.

The Clerk laid before the Council a Notice of Application for Compensation for Criminal Injury to Property served on him on behalf of a man named Peter Naughton for £60. for damage done to hay on the lands of Clonbeggaun by fire on the 18th ultimo.

ORDERED - To be referred to the Solicitors to defend.
