three paid with some deductions. All the instalments of maintenance contracts dealt with to-day, being the closing instalments of the financial year, must be either paid or struck off, no part may be deferred.

Three instalments for Special Works deferred at last Meeting may now be paid off with small deductions.

At the time of inspection just ended the condition of the surfaces of the roads under continuous maintenance was as follows:- 4 were Fair and 25 were Middling.

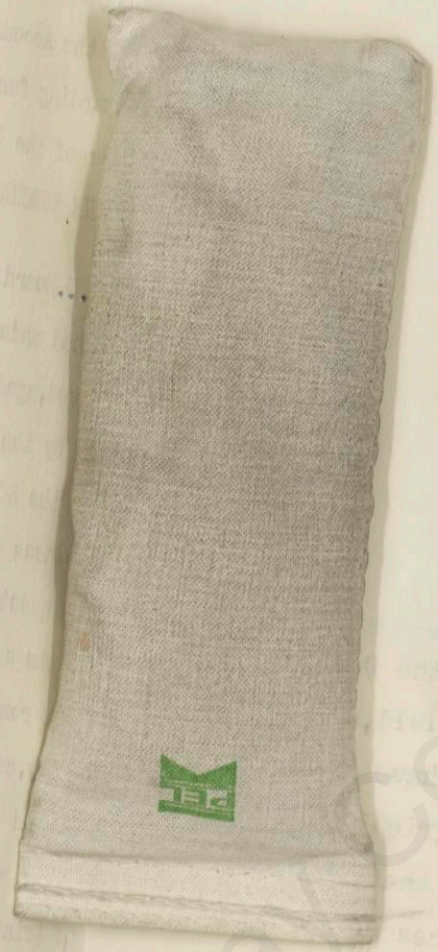
