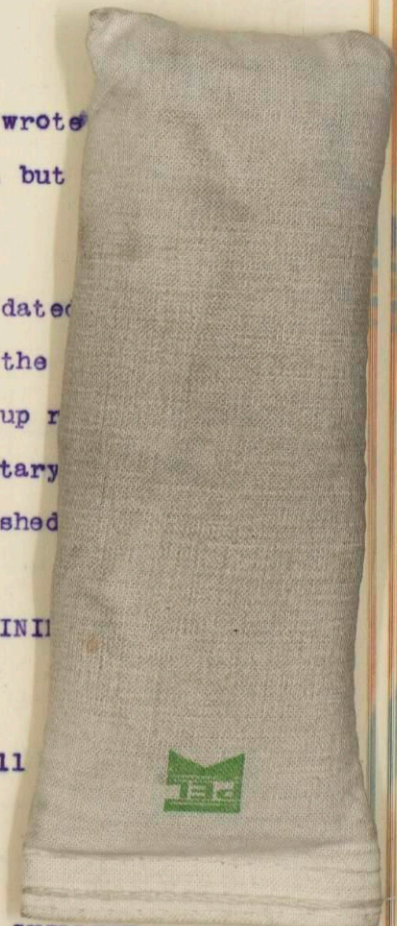

and 3 Bad, and of those under Contract 1 was Good, 11 Fair and 4 Middling.

These three bad roads are receiving special attention, the contracts for their repair formerly were so reduced in price that it was found impossible to obtain their fulfilment. However, I hope to effect a considerable improvement in them by Direct Labour work.

I had intended recommending you to make proposal for half the estimated cost of improving, by steam-rolling, the road from Ballinasloe to Athlone with the view of obtaining free grant from the Road Board for the other half of the cost, but the reply given by the Road Board lately to my application for similar grant, for the Athlone end of the same line of road, suggested that the County Council might defer proceeding with expensive improvement work until more normal conditions obtain, and the Local Government Board are postponing their sanction of loans wherever they consider the work is not urgently required.

The work lately begun by Direct Labour is proceeding fairly well. Some little improvement work of surface shaping and drainage has been begun and I hope to effect a good deal of improvement in surface work this season.

We must defer for the present all consideration of improving roads by steam rolling as the Road Board funds have been transferred to the National service Account and no grants will be made for any work which is not urgently necessary. We must only try to show in Ballinasloe District that roads of light traffic may be made to have a perfectly even surface by the ordinary patching system when properly carried out. I have in other Districts some lengths of roads maintained by Direct Labour on which the surface has been made perfectly even without any steam rolling. It is only on roads of heavy traffic and on roads which have either been let to wear out or were never properly surfaced that steam-rolling is of use to prevent public inconvenience at times of laying on of the road material.
