

Friday 5th April 1850. Continued.

The Clerk begs leave to state that the Board have made no account
made for issuing Civil Bills, but have made an order for cutting
off the Gas from such Consumers as owe three Months Gas Bills (see
minutes 25th Sept. 1849) and that previous to giving instructions
to the Solicitor Mr. Blake, he called on Mr. Hyde and Mr. Poynter,
the former owing £3.13.6 for six Months private lights to 1st March,
and the latter £2.9.0 for eight Months to same period, requesting
that their Bills, would be paid up, and if the entire amount was
not convenient, to leave but two Months due, otherwise Civil Bills
would issue, (considering it less expending than cutting off the Gas)
this not having been complied with, Civil Bills were served.

The Clerk begs to state that a service pipe would be required
from the Main to convey Gas into the shop of Mr. Elliott, as that the
pipe there ~~is~~ be regulated, for at present it is not adequate
for two lights, also that Miss Gregory although having all necessary
fittings cannot light, in consequence of the service pipe being conveyed
under the flag at the Hall Door, and so inclined that water is lodged
therein. The Clerk would suggest that this pipe would be changed
and the Gas conveyed by a pipe round the end of the flag, with an
inclination from thence to the Geyser, at the road.
